FOG CAUSES ACCIDENTS.

TWO CRASHES ON THE ELEVATED ROAD AND SEVERAL IN THE BAY.

PASSENGERS PANIC-STRICKEN AND A RAILROAD MAN INJURED—BOTH COLLISIONS MAN WITHIN EIGHT MINUTES.

An unusually dense fog settled over the city and the harbor early yesterday morning, greatly impeding navigation and seriously affecting the running of the surface and elevated railroads.

The fog was thickest there, it being difficult to see more than a few feet ahead.

Both accidents were rear-end collisions. The first occurred at about 6:45 a. m. An engine pulling a long train of cars on the down track had gone only a short distance from the Forty-second-st. station, when an engine, behind which were five passenger-cars, crashed into it.

No one was badly hurt in the collision, but in the confusion and darkness of the line which followed the collision, a serious accident occurred. About eight minutes after the first collision a train had passed Forty-seventh-st., and was proceeding slowly down town, but the fog was so dense that the blockade ahead could not be seen at first.

The fireman, Morrison, did not jump in time, and was severely scalded by the boiler fire, and the foot was crushed. He was taken to Bellevue Hospital, where his wounds were dressed.

Disgracefully Dirty Pavements. Wretched condition of the sidewalks about City Hall park.

Thousands of persons who have had occasion to walk along Mall-st., or on the sidewalks in Broadway and Park Row next to City Hall Park, since the recent snowstorm, have complained with good reason of the filthy condition of the walks.

Workmen in the employ of the Park Department shovelled the snow off the walks and left it piled on the edges of the park.

Why the work there has been allowed to drag its heels has been a mystery to many people. It has been suggested that Mayor Van Wyck might make a favorable impression by causing the Park Board to have the sidewalks cleaned.
