ON REVIEW AT THE GARDEN.

THE TROOPS PASS BEFORE GENERAL MILES AMID LOUD CHEERS.

A GREAT CROWD ATTRACTED BY HIS PRESENCE AT THE MILITARY CARNIVAL—SALUTING BY CANNON PROVES SOMEWHAT TERRIFYING—COMPETITIONS BETTER THAN EVER.

Madison Square Garden was packed to the doors last night, and the Military Bicycle and Athletic Carnival showed to better advantage than ever before. The programme was carried through with fore. The programme was carried through with fore. The programme was carried through with fore.

The presence of Major-General Nelson A. Miles and a large party of friends and his review of the troops appeared to be the magnet which attracted the majority of the seven thousand people present.

Possibly the soldiers are like actors, in that they can do their best only in the presence of a large and enthusiastic number of spectators, for it is certain that they went through the manoeuvres last night in better form than has been the case heretofore.

One of the companies experimented with one of the big guns yesterday afternoon, so that there would no hitch last night when the proper time arrived to salute General Miles. A full charge of powder was put in, and when the explosion took place it seemed for an instant as if the building was coming down.

The soldiers saw that such a thing would not do, and on the next attempt only half a charge of powder was rammed home.

The explosion this time only brought down a few panes of glass from the skylight. After the broken glass was swept up, in order to save the bicycle tires, the officers in charge decided that a quarter charge would make noise enough, and at the same time show proper respect to the general.

When the charge was fired off in the crowded amphitheatre, last night about seven thousand poor souls were threatened with temporary deafness. The scare, however, was only momentary, and it soon passed away. Previously only caps had been used on the larger guns in the military manoeuvres. When the cannon roared last night, however, it quickly brought the spectators to their feet.

REVIEW OF THE TROOPS.

The review of the troops by General Miles was one of the most impressive sights seen at the Garden in a long time. The general and his friends were seated in arena boxes in the centre of the building on the Twenty-sixth-st. side. Those in the party were: Major-General and Mrs. Miles, Captain P. Misher, United States Army; Captain M. P. Mans, United States Army; Major-General Wesley Merritt, United States Army; Colonel S. S. Sumner, Lieut. Colonel, United States Army; First Lieutenant H. J. Gallagher, 4th Cavalry, United States Army; Second Lieutenant J. Donald Cameron, of Pennsylvania; Mrs. Hoyt and Miss Hoyt, P. T. Cushman Sherman, Mrs. Newport, Mrs. Hoyt, C. Ten Eyck and Mr. and Mrs. Joseph A. McCord.

General Miles arrived at 8 p. m., and the commander of the Army received an enthusiastic welcome. The companies passed in review in regulation form, with the sailors from the monitor Troop, now in the harbor, the first in line. The detachments in line were as follows: 8th Regiment, N. G. N. Y.; 12th Regiment, N. G. N. Y.; 23d Regiment, N. G. N. Y.; 4th Regiment, N. Y. Naval Reserves; 1st Battery, N. G. N. Y.; 2d Battery, N. G. N. Y.; 6th United States Cavalry; Troops A and E, and a detachment from Troop C, of Brooklyn. The 5th United States Artillery did not go out, as possibly there was not room enough in the arena for them. The State troops and the regulars presented a fine appearance, and they were generally applauded.

THE COMPETITIONS.

Even the track was in better shape last night and in consequence the bicycling and athletic contests were faster and more exciting. The military manoeuvres of the different companies were a decided improvement possibly on anything ever seen in the Garden. The musical drill, callisthenics, wrestling and battle exercises of the company from the 15th United States Infantry evoked loud applause. The athletic soldiers seem to improve with every exhibition, and as they used smokeless powder their firing scenes, even the most critical could not find fault. The men are as supple as perfectly trained professional athletes.

The mounted platoon drill, which included musical and mechanical manoeuvres, executed by a troop from the 6th United States Cavalry, under the command of Captain B. H. Chever, was another agreeable part of the entertainment. The horses are trained almost as well as the men, and the equine knowledge displayed by the four-footed friends of the man was little short of astonishing. They waltzed to the rhythm of the music, and did fancy side steps, to the immense delight of the women and children and the wonder of the men. The bareback feats and rough riding, which followed, were little less remarkable.

While the 2d Battery, N. G. N. Y., was in the arena the band struck up "America." General Miles arose and removed his hat, and nearly every spectator in the amphitheatre did the same. The music gradually died away in the solemn, songlike cadence, the onlookers resumed their seats, with blood coursing more swiftly in the veins, and the same went on for some time.
