THE AUTHOR OF DIXIE.

DANIEL EMMETT, WHO WROTE THE FAMOUS SONG, IS STILL LIVING.

The man who wrote "Dixie" is still living, and though he is destitute, is happy that he has lived to hear the North and South sing his famous song. His name is Daniel Emmett, and he was born in 1815 in Vernon, Ohio, where his home is in Mount Vernon, Ohio, where he has lived since 1845 and where he hopes to end his days. He lives all alone in a little cottage in the outskirts of the town, and is fond of reading and recounting his early experiences. Though one of the Beau Brummels of other days, he is satisfied now to go around town with his coat fastened in at his waist with a piece of rope, and his head sheltered by a shabby looking skull cap. The story of how he came to write "Dixie" is told by himself as follows: "The song is composed like everything else I ever did, because it had to be done. One Saturday night in 1852, as I was leaving Bryant's Theatre, where I sing and do everything, I saw a man in a 'walk round' for Monday, Dan. The next day it rained and I stayed indoors. At first when I went out to get my mail, I saw a man in a 'walk round' and I wished I was in Dixie. I kept repeating it in my mind, and I finally took it for my start. The next day I was in Dixie, and I wrote the song and it was in Dixie. I made a hit at once, and before the end of the week I sold the song in New York and in the South. I then took it up and sold it for its own value. I sold the copyright for \$50, which was all I ever made from it. Mr. Emmett has a special manuscript of the song and intends to give it to some historical society in the South. He himself was the son of a famous 'nigger' minstrel in the country. He was among the pioneers of that art and impersonated the negro so successfully with songs, banjo, fiddle, and other instruments that he became and made famous the 'Virginia Minstrel,' as his company was called. Strangely enough, 'Dixie,' or 'Dixie Land,' referred to the South or to any part of the South. It was the name of an estate on Manhattan Island, the property of a man by the name of Dixy, who was one of the largest slaveholders of the North. It was from this Dixy that the name of the Dixie Land movement in the North came. It was to sell his slaves South. It was from these blacks and their descendants that the words of 'Dixie Land' came, expressing their love and longing for their former home and master. 'Dixie' was written a week or two ago by the author of 'Dixie,' but it was not published until it was found in a book by the name of 'Dixie Land' and it is said to be in poor circumstances.
