

T. E. PALMA EXPLAINS.

STATEMENT AS TO THE EXPENDITURE OF THE CUBAN JUNTA'S MONEY.

Tomas Estrada Palma, who was the delegate of the Cuban Revolutionary Government to this country, gave out the following statement yesterday, in reply to the demand made by the Cuban-American League that he account for the money handed by him during the Cuban rebellion:

I have reported from time to time to the Cuban Provisional Government, about all the affairs of the delegation in this country and abroad, including the accounts of the Treasury. In accordance with a resolution of the Assembly, enacted April 4, 1896, I am presenting in my Secretary's report the expenditure in order to deliver them to the definite government to be established in Cuba. Complying with the resolution, I have deposited the records and archives in a fireproof storage building, and have everything ready to make a full report to my government as soon as it may be finally constituted. My accounts are full and complete, and the Cuban Government may publish them or not, as it sees fit. I am the trustee of the Cuban Provisional Government to turn these things over to the new government, and I will carry out that obligation, as I have carried out every other obligation. The allegation that nearly \$7,000,000 was collected is simply ridiculous. The whole amount received from voluntary contributions of bonds and taxes, as follows: From January 1, 1895, to January 30, 1896—Contributions of clubs and agencies, and donations from Cubans and other persons residing in the United States, \$36,000; contributions of clubs and agencies and donations of Cubans and other persons residing in Mexico, the West Indies, Central and South America, including remittances made by the agent of the delegation, Dr. Aristide Agramonte, from countries of the West Indies, \$10,000; taxes paid by planters and others direct to the delegation or remitted by the Government, \$10,000; net realized in the sale of bonds, \$30,000; total, \$1,512,000.

A suit brought by Mrs. Bridget Hoey, the mother of the late William Hoey, the comedian, commonly known as "Old Hoey," together with several of her children, to set aside a deed made by Hoey conveying property at One-hundred-and-eleventh-st. and Lexington-ave. to his wife, Helena G. Hoey, was called in the Supreme Court before Justice Russell yesterday. On the motion of A. H. Hummel, who represents Hoey's widow, the case was adjourned to Monday, June 5, on the ground that Charles E. Evans, one of the principal witnesses in the action, was absent in Europe, but would be back by the date mentioned.
