

SENATE AGAINST RAMAPO.

FALLOWS BILL PASSES THE UPPER HOUSE BY A LARGE VOTE.

Albany, March 19 (Special).—Another step toward guarding the city of New-York from making a disastrous contract with the Ramapo Water Company was taken to-night, the Senate passing the Fallovs bill.

The measure amends the city charter so as to make it unlawful for the Commissioner of Water Supply to make any contract with a private water company, like the Ramapo Water Company, unless he receives the assent of the Board of Public Improvements and of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, together with the separate written consent and approval of the Mayor and the Controller of the city of New-York.

The debate on the bill in the Senate to-night was of a brief nature. Senator Grady moved that its enactment be stricken out.

Senator Ford in reply said that, of course, Senator Grady was aware that the bill was drawn to prevent the city of New-York making a \$200,000,000 contract with the Ramapo Water Company.

The Merchants' Association has arranged for another delegation to go to Albany to-day in its fight in the Ramapo water case.

Water supply short in the Bronx.
