

FLEET TRACK ATHLETES.

CLOSE CONTESTS EXPECTED AT THE COMING INTERCOLLEGIATE GAMES. PRINCETON'S RISING STAR.

The prospect is for a hard, close fight at the intercollegiate athletic games, to be held at Columbia Field, in this city, next Friday and Saturday. The University of Pennsylvania is not going to have the walkover that she has had for the last two years.

The preliminary athletic season on track and field this year has been of unusual interest, for the number of interuniversity contests has been greater than ever before. One of the noteworthy features of the season has been the entrance of the University of California's athletes into the Eastern lists.

HARVARD WINS OUT HANDILY.

Among other dual meets, those of chief importance have been the ones between Princeton and Columbia, the Tigers proving a fairly easy winner, and between Harvard and Yale, the Crimson surprising everybody with a victory by a margin of 20 points.

Rain was too much for the polo enthusiasts yesterday, and H. L. Herbert announced that the final match for the Country Club cups was postponed until to-morrow afternoon.


