THE "TICKERS" TAKEN OUT.
INSTRUMENTS REMOVED FROM THE OFFICES OF TWO FIRMS—WHAT MEMBERS SAY.

The Gold and Stock Telegraph Company, which sends out the Stock Exchange quotations, yesterday morning removed its "ticker" instruments from the offices of Ennis & Stoppall, No. 34 New-st., and H. C. Friedman & Co., No. 10 Wall-st. Both houses are connected with the Consolidated Stock and Petroleum Exchange. Mr. Stoppall, speaking for his firm, said yesterday that he knew of no reason why the tickers should have been removed. The firm was doing a perfectly legitimate business, and its books were always open to inspection by the authorities of the Exchange. President Wagar of the Consolidated Exchange said:

Of course the Stock Exchange can do what it will with its own, but its action in the case of Ennis & Stoppall seems to have been entirely unprovoked. The firm had been doing a very large business on our Exchange. In December it cleared through the Consolidated Exchange clearing house \$250,000 shares. It has been doing a perfectly straight business.

The firm of H. C. Friedman & Co. had eight tickers, one in each of its two branch offices and six in its main office, at No. 10 Wall-st. Seven of the eight were removed yesterday, one being left in the Wall-st. office. A member of the firm said: I haven't the remotest idea why our tickers were taken out. We are doing an honest business. Our operations have always been open and above board. We have never had any trouble with the authorities. We are being made to suffer for the wrongdoing of others. Will we make a protest? What will it avail us?



DENY EXPRESS COMPANIES' ALLIANCE.
RUMORS CIRCULATED CONCERNING PLANS OF NEWLY FORMED METROPOLITAN COMPANY.

Various rumors were in circulation yesterday regarding the intentions of the new Metropolitan Express Company, incorporated at Albany on December 31. The idea that it was formed for the purpose of consolidating the United States and American express companies was ridiculed by the officers of these companies. The report of such an alliance was strongly denied by James C. Fargo, president of the American Express Company. Frank H. Platt, who owns 4.96 of the 5,000 shares of the stock of the new Metropolitan Company, declined to give any hint as to his future plans. It was also reported that there was to be a general consolidation of express companies having their chief offices in this city, for the purpose of running a local service in connection with the Metropolitan Street Railway Company, after the manner of the National Express Company in Brooklyn. CENTRAL TO RUN MOUNTAIN ROAD.
President Callaway and General Manager Van Eiten of the New-York Central have made an arrangement with the stockholders of the Raquette Lake Railroad, running from Clearwater, on the Central's Mohawk and Malone Division, to Raquette Lake, sixteen miles, to operate the road for them and charge up to them whatever deficits there may be from year to year. Many of the stockholders are dissatisfied with the plan, but the road is largely instrumental in having the road built, as it gave him and others better transportation to their estates in the Adirondacks. SMALL CHILDREN FOUND DESERTED.
Four children, Joseph, Lizzie, Marnie and Charles Polombo, ten, eight, seven and six years old, respectively, were committed to the care of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children yesterday by Magistrate Meade in the Harlem police court. They were found late Tuesday alone in a sparsely furnished flat on the top floor of the tenement house at No. 117 East One-hundred-and-eighty-st. It is said they had been deserted by their mother. The police of the East One-hundred-and-fourth-st. station, to whom the children's condition had been reported, informed the society agents. From neighbors it was learned that the father of the children, Peter Polombo, is a barber, employed in Washington. He sent money each week to Mrs. Polombo for the support of these children. A few days ago he sent Mrs. Polombo a sum of money and instructed her to buy furniture and move to Washington. It is charged that Mrs. Polombo did pack up her furniture, but that she did not ship it to Washington, and that she deserted the children, leaving them without food and with little clothing. The society agents are looking for her, and have informed the children's father.

CHILDREN'S FEAR OF S. P. C. AGENTS.
"I know that many East Side children become frightened when they are told that they must go with our agents," said Vernon M. Davis, president of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, at his office at No. 229 Broadway, yesterday. "I don't see how this fear can be allayed. It is said that they sometimes prefer to stay at home and endure cruelty on the part of their parents rather than place themselves under our protection. The children are ignorant of the administration of the society, and for that reason they believe they are to enter some painful captivity."

WORK OF CITY'S LAW DEPARTMENT.
