BABY THAT WAS BURIED ALIVE DIES. MOTHER, WHO WILL BE CHARGED WITH MURDER, COLLAPSES WHEN SHE HEARS OF THE DEATH. Although strenuous efforts were made to save the life of the baby that was buried alive by its parents, Francesca Spinello and Giovanni Buticovello, in a tragedy at Hastings-on-the-Hudson, a Polish lawyer, asking for information regarding the estate of Ignate Grodsky, who died here on October 1, 1863, leaving property consisting of a large sum of money, plantations, etc., which had been left in the hands of the public administrator.
