

CREED REVISION DECREED.

PRESBYTERIAN GENERAL ASSEMBLY ACTS WITH PRACTICAL UNANIMITY. DR. MOFFATT INTRODUCES HARMONIZING AMENDMENT—TO MEET IN FIFTH AVENUE CHURCH NEXT YEAR.

Philadelphia, May 27.—After deciding without a word of discussion or a dissenting vote that the next place of meeting should be the Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in New-York, the General Assembly this morning decreed, and in an hour settled with unanimity, the question of revising the Westminster Confession of Faith is concerned, and a new creedal statement for popular use. Of five hundred or more commissioners present and voting there were less than a dozen negative votes.
