

The extremely high crown has a large flat bow of shirred pink Louisiane directly across the front, with six white ostrich plumes waving above.

The model shown in men's silk hats illustrates the more pronounced nature of the bell crown and the shorter curve of the brim in the present season. A black band is adopted by the ultra fashionable, as both the United States and England are in mourning. Men's derby hats for the coming season are fuller in the crown than formerly, and the brims have the full round D'Orray curve. The soft felt hats for men, in the new Eriodora shape, come in two widths of brims and two heights of crowns. The smaller hat with the low crown and small brim is intended for young men, and the full crown with the wide brim is adapted to older men. The brims are known as the open roll flanged brims, some being bound with silk, and others having the raw edge. The leading colors in these hats are pearl gray and black.

The Raquet hat for young men has a full crown, not high, a flat brim and raw edge finish. All the hats have silk bands to match the color of the hat, and are made on the new shape block which lends itself to the formation of a crease in the center of the crown. The New-York Yacht Club yachting caps have a full round, flat crown, silk braided band and leather visor.



FASCINATING COSTUMES.

LOVELY ARTISTIC TOUCHES ON GOWNS OF MARKED CHARACTER.

The upper part of the skirt is of black mousseline de soie over white taffeta, showing tucked, graduated panels of black flit inclosing motifs of white flit. Each panel is trimmed with black flit and velvet. A lower skirt has graduated ruffles of black and white mousseline, used alternately. Each ruffle is edged with black ribbon velvet, and motifs of white flit appear at intervals.
