One of the most ghastly crimes in the police records of this city was discovered yesterday when the badly mutilated body of Albert Robinson Ryan, five years old, was found, wrapped in a burp bag, in the areaway in front of the four-story apartment house at No. 361 West Twenty-second street.

As soon as the body was received at the station Sergeant Burke called all the policemen there to see if they could identify it. Police-men Hogan and Cahane were of the opinion that they had seen the boy in the neighborhood of Peter B. Hughes and Central Office Detective McCarthy were detailed to work on the case.
