

CUBAN ELECTION PLANS.

MR. PIERRA SETS FORTH ADDITIONAL REASONS WHY DATE SHOULD BE DEFERRED.

To the Editor of the Tribune. BRITISH PRISONERS RELEASED.

London, Dec. 29.—The War Office has received a dispatch from Lord Kitchener, dated Johannesburg, saying that the British prisoners captured when the Boers successfully rushed Colonel Finner's camp at Zeefontein on December 24, have been liberated and returned to Bethlehem.

JAPANESE PERISH IN STORM.

Vancouver, B. C., Dec. 29.—Twenty Japanese are missing from Stevenson, and are supposed to have been killed or drowned in the destruction of a Japanese boarding house between Stevenson and Point Roberts on Thursday morning.

DR. VON HOLLEBEN MAY BE BEST MAN FOR HIS FRIEND DR. WOOD.

Baltimore, Dec. 29 (Special).—Dr. Henry Wood, professor of German at Johns Hopkins University, has announced that he will marry Frau Levin of Kretschman, of Berlin, next June. Miss von Kretschman belongs to the German nobility, a cousin of Count von Eulenberg. She is twenty-eight and Dr. Wood is a widower of fifty. They first met last June, when she was visiting in this city.

NO FRICTION AT MANILA. YESTERDAY'S MUSIC.

The enthusiasm of the seekers after music at popular prices was not to be dampened, even by yesterday's weather. To the musician Sunday is no longer a day of rest, but much the contrary. An occasional "sacred concert" used to be the rule. The Metropolitan affairs stimulated emulation two years or so ago, and for a time there was rivalry between the Opera House and Carnegie Hall; but it did not turn out profitably.

CIVIL AND MILITARY AUTHORITIES WORK IN HARMONY.

Manila, Dec. 29.—General Chaffee when asked to-day by the correspondent of The Associated Press about the alleged friction between the civil and military authorities in the Philippine archipelago said that absolutely no such friction existed and that perfect harmony prevailed between the two authorities. General Chaffee said that the only occasion when there had been anything approaching friction was in the matter of habeas corpus proceedings in the case of Oakley Brooks, and that upon this occasion a solution of the difficulty satisfactory to both authorities had been found.

GENERAL CHAFFEE AND ACTING GOVERNOR WRIGHT TALK CONFIDENTLY OF THE SITUATION IN THE ISLANDS.

General Chaffee further explained that every time the slightest friction had arisen in the provinces between the two authorities he had invariably ordered the military to surrender to the civil authority, and said that the relations of these authorities throughout the provinces, where they frequently held widely opposite opinions, would in no way interrupt the existing cordial relations at Manila, where both were working toward the same goal, namely, the pacification and welfare of the Philippine archipelago.

THE PROSPECTS PROMISING.

General Chaffee concluded by saying that he thought the prospect of subduing the insurrection in all places to be promising. Acting Governor Wright, on this same subject, said: "Where men of sense are at the head of affairs, there is not likely to be much cause for alarm or friction."

MAJORITY OF NATIVES PEACEFUL.

Governor Wright said he was satisfied that the majority of the Filipinos recognize and appreciate what has been done, and that their leaders were doing all in their power to bring the remaining insurgents to a peaceful view of the situation. Concluding, Governor Wright said that the natives inhabiting the island of Samar had during all their history been an unmanageable race, and that he was not surprised at their present hostility.

APPOINTMENT OF A ROYAL COMMISSION ANNOUNCED IN LONDON.

London, Dec. 29.—A royal commission has been appointed to inquire into the coal resources of Great Britain. The questions to be covered by the commission's inquiries will include the rate of possible exhaustion of British coal fields, the effect of the export of coal on the home supply, the possibility of a reduction in its cost by cheaper transportation, and whether the coal mining industry of Great Britain, under the existing conditions, is maintaining its competitive power with foreign coal fields.

BALTIMORE PASTOR FOR NEW-BEDFORD.

Baltimore, Dec. 29 (Special).—The Rev. William B. Geoghegan to-day announced to the congregation of the First Independent Unitarian Church that he had accepted the call to the pastorate of the Unitarian Church at New-Bedford, Mass., one of the old churches in the country, having been founded in 1708.

THE WEATHER REPORT.

Washington, Dec. 29.—The storm central Saturday evening in Southern Alabama has moved slowly eastward and to-night forms a long trough of low pressure extending from Maine to Virginia.
