

DEATH STOPS INQUIRY.

MAN WHO MADE CHARGES IN BROOKLYN DEMOCRATIC FIGHT EXPIRES.

Just at the moment that Colonel James D. Bell, chairman of a special committee of the Kings County Democratic General Committee, was about to report to that body concerning charges that had been made by Kyram J. Farrell against William J. Doyle, the leader of the VIII Assembly District of Kings County, Mr. Farrell was breathing his last at his home, No. 236 Fifty-fourth-st., South Brooklyn. His death caused a postponement of the meeting.

There is a fight on in the VIII District between Mr. Doyle and Luke D. Stapleton, who has been trying to get the leadership. At a meeting of the General Committee held a month ago Mr. Farrell, a Stapleton man, made serious charges against Mr. Doyle in a speech from the floor. He said that Doyle never got a place for a man without exacting some reward, and that his leadership had been the cause of the best interests of the party. A committee was appointed to try Doyle. It was afterward found that the committee had no power to take testimony, and a report was prepared advising the General Committee itself to hear the evidence on both sides.

When the meeting opened last night Colonel Bell, the chairman of the Doyle committee, was about to present the report when Mr. Stapleton announced that Mr. Farrell, who had preferred the charges and was to be present last night to give evidence regarding them, was at the point of death. In view of that he moved that the subject be laid over. There was some objection to this, and while the question was still being discussed a telephone message was received saying that Mr. Farrell had died. The meeting adjourned at once.

EXPRESS TRAIN HELD UP.

ROBBERS UNCOUPLED THE CARS AND GOT AWAY WITH TWO SAFES.

Charleston, S. C., Jan. 27.—Meagre details of a daring express robbery near Branchville this evening have been received. As the northbound train from Charleston slowed up two miles from Branchville the engineer, fireman and conductor were ordered by several masked men, with pistols, to stop the train. The robbers overawed the passengers, uncoupled the engine, the express and baggage cars, went two miles up the road, unloaded the iron express safes, put them on a wagon and drove away. The express messenger was ordered by the robbers to unlock the safes. He told them that he did not know the combination.

The leader is supposed to be the notorious Bartow Warren, who robbed the express car within a few miles of Branchville in 1899. He murdered the chief witness against him, escaped from jail, and recently has been reported as at large in Orangeburg County.

Later details state that seven men were in the party that robbed the express car near Branchville. A telegram has been received here asking for bloodhounds to be sent to the scene. The postoffice at Walterboro, twenty miles from Branchville, was blown up with dynamite last night and robbed of several hundred dollars. It is believed the same party was responsible for the communication with Branchville. The wire was cut to-night about the time of the robbery.

CALLS JEROME SAINT.

The New York Protestant Episcopal City Mission Society, also spoke, as did the Rev. James Hunter, secretary of the Reformed Social Union, on the forward movement in the Reformed Church, as distinguished from the forward movement supported by it.

Brief addresses were made by the Rev. Drs. Henry A. Stinson, of the Manhattan Congregational Church, and the Rev. Dr. E. S. Tappan, of the Methodist Episcopal Church. The Rev. Dr. H. A. Gerdson discussed "The Moravians." The last speaker at the morning session was the Rev. Dr. George U. Wenner, who spoke of the Lutherans.

The Rev. Dr. Leander T. Chamberlain presided at the afternoon session. The first address was delivered by the Rev. Dr. S. Parkes Cadman, of the Central Congregational Church, Brooklyn. He spoke on "Our Field in Its Relation to the Problems of Religion in American Cities."

The Rev. Dr. A. F. Schaffner, vice-president of the New York City Mission and Tract Society, spoke on "Immigration." "The Need of Scientific Charity in the Work of the Churches" was the subject chosen by J. F. Jackson, associate secretary of the Charity Organization Society.

At the night session of the conference Mayor Charles A. Scherer of Brooklyn introduced the general subject, "The City as an Opportunity." The Rev. John Hopkins Denison, of the Church of the Sea and Land, spoke on "The Latent Good in Our Citizens."

"There is a great movement to close saloons at present," he said. "The saloons in my section of the city are the worst in existence—veritable hell holes—but the men have no other place to go.

He suggested that public rooms, where men might smoke and read, should be established, and that if the men had some decent place to go they would not go to the vile places. He said that what was being done along such lines was not one-tenth enough. He advocated houses for boys to exercise in and day nurseries.

Truman J. Backus, president of Packer Institute, spoke on "The Duty of Churches Toward Municipal Progress."

Robert E. Speer, secretary of the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions, closed the session with an address on "Christ and the City." He thought that in the question of the excise he thought that every child of over two years should be consulted, and that from the newspaper discussion of the subject one might think that adult males formed the whole world.

"GREAT BRITAIN'S FRIENDSHIP." ROPEAN COALITION SAID TO HAVE BEEN DISSOLVED BY HER AVOWED INTENTION TO USE OTHER MEANS THAN DIPLOMACY.
