

WOULD ABOLISH CORONERS

LAWYERS AGREE WITH DISTRICT ATTORNEY JEROME—PREVIOUS LEGISLATION THAT HAS FAILED.

Many of the prominent lawyers of the city agree with District Attorney Jerome that it is about time to have legislation to abolish the Coroners' Office, and have the preliminary investigations of suspicious deaths made by physicians attached to the Health Department.

It has been suggested that there would be a great saving of expense to the city by having physicians of the Health Department make the necessary autopsies in cases of sudden or suspicious death, and have the regular magistrates of the city take charge of the judicial inquiries where such are necessary in accident cases, as well as in homicide cases, and hold prisoners for the grand jury.

NOT AGAINST COMPETITIVE SYSTEM.

COMMISSIONER RUSSELL SAYS THERE ARE REASONS WHY RATES SHOULD NOT APPLY TO MANY OF HIS EMPLOYEES.

William Hepburn Russell, Commissioner of Accounts, denied yesterday that he was against civil service regulations as applied to his office. "I believe in civil service," said Mr. Russell, "but there are excellent reasons why the regulations should not apply to a large number of employees in my department. I am going to try to have placed in the exempt class eight chief examiners and from sixteen to twenty-five clerks. These salaries will be made up to less than 50 per cent of our office force. All the others in the office could wisely be kept on the competitive system."

THE PRICE OF OIL RAISED.

INDEPENDENT COMPANIES AND THE STANDARD REACH AN UNDERSTANDING.

The Standard Oil Company and the four independent companies which have been selling kerosene oil in Hudson County to retail dealers have reached an understanding, and the wholesale price of kerosene will be raised to 10 cents a gallon. The board is authorized to select a site anywhere in the State outside of Trenton. The bill provides for regular and elective courses and that any resident of the State shall be eligible. No charge for instruction is to be made to such persons.
