That there can be a close relation between the revelations of geology and a nation's character and destiny is a comparatively new thought. This, however, is the fundamental idea of the "Regions of the World" series, to which Mr. MacKinder contributes the first volume, and he effectively demonstrates the soundness of the proposition therein.

Another circumstance which has exercised a powerful and beneficent influence on Britain is her climate. Though situated as far north as bleak and frigid Labrador, the genial warmth of the Gulf Stream drift keeps the sea open all around her in midwinter and affords easy access to her ports from all parts of the globe.

When shrinkage of the interior of the globe through cooling formed more or less sharply folded ridges on the crust, deep seated rock strata of enormous thickness were tilted up at various angles. Then something else was done by the crests of these enormous wrinkles and exposed the edges of layers which had once been hidden.

The region discussed by Mr. Hogarth is designated "The Nearer East," to distinguish it from the greater Orient to which it is a gateway. It extends from Western Persia to the Adriatic Sea, and from the Caspian, Black Sea and Danube to the Upper Nile. Continuous and comparatively compact in form as is this area, it represents wonderful differences in climate, scenery, fertility and population.

Though Von Zittel writes for the technical rather than the popular reader, his book will prove an exceedingly valuable contribution to the literature of geology. After an elaborate introduction, the author takes up the various branches of the science separately—rock composition, the forces which have acted upon the crust of the earth from above and below, the revelations of fossils and the classification of strata.
