THE RACETRACK. FAVORITES HAVE THEIR DAY—KEENE'S COLORS IN FRONT AT CONEY ISLAND.

The Keene stable was victorious in two excellent races at Sheepshead Bay yesterday. Hurst Park, after his third effort to get to the front, won the Spring Stakes from a fair field, and Port Royal, the third time this season, carried Shaw under the wire in advance of four noteworthy rivals.

Rightful justified his reputation for being a cuppy track by winning a two-year-old race in handy fashion from St. Jude and Buttons. Clarion had no excuse for his bad showing, unless he prefers a hard track. He was the favorite, heavily backed by the public, but his race was simply awful. Shaw worked as hard as he could, but finally could not keep up with the leaders.

Fort Royal won the fifth race. Pretorius was supported and Cunard had many friends, but they could never catch the Keene colt, which took the lead at the start, and won all the way. Creamer could not do Francesco justice and finished last. Port Royal is a colt of more than ordinary merit. He has a great deal of speed and a good deal of staying power.

Ada Nay was added in the Spring Stakes, and Africander carried C. F. Dwyer's colors and won first time. The speculation was for a time in the Spring Stakes. The steady support on Hurst Park brought him down from 3 to 1 to 2 to 1, while Africander's price drifted backward from 7 to 5 to 2 to 1. Hurst Park won by a length after a desperate finish. Ada Nay came on with her usual dash and secured third money. Mizzen and Golden Maxm were scratched on account of their hard race on Saturday.

At 4:20 o'clock the signal was given for the start of the third race. The boats luffed around the stern of the committee boat and got away in the

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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
