TOPICS IN PARIS.

Public Feeling Against Turkey—A Humbert Reaction.

(Special to the New York Tribune by French Cable.)
Paris, Feb. 14.—The situation in the Balkan peninsula and the reports of the atrocities in that mosaic of heterogeneous races and religions known as Macedonia has aroused public feeling in France, and popular meetings are to be held on Sunday, not only of French Nationalists, but Liberal Republicans and Socialists.

The twenty-second annual exhibition of women painters and sculptors was opened yesterday by President Loubet in the Grand Palace of Fine Arts.

Meanwhile, Mme. Bachmeteff, wife of the Russian representative at Sofia, who has herself recently visited the villages in Macedonia where the disorder prevails, is at present at St. Petersburg, and in long conversations with the Emperor has set forth the true state of affairs, and has impressed upon his majesty that time is an absolutely vital question, for general massacres and fighting seem unavoidable as soon as spring weather sets in.
