Of course Mr. Cooke can draw, legitimately enough, upon certain genuinely significant names. Emerson and Lowell, Thoreau and Channing, whom he naturally places in the forefront of his collection.

As for the minor figures in this anthology—and most of them are very unimportant indeed—we may give their transcendentalism its fullest value and still, through the paucity of poetic quality in their work, they leave us convinced of their inconsequence.
