ANOTHER BANK CLOSES.

Allegheny Concern Carried Under by Pittsburg Failure.

Pittsburg, Oct. 22.—Following the suspension yesterday of the Federal National Bank, of this city, its First National Bank of Allegheny directed to open its doors for business to-day, and its directors have informed the Controller of the Currency that the institution has gone into voluntary liquidation, and requested him to take the necessary action in such cases.

The suspension of the First National, which has been the representative of the Federal National in the clearing house, is looked upon by bankers generally as an almost necessary sequence of the failure yesterday, and it is believed that no further trouble will follow.
