INCREASE OF ARMY MEDICAL CORPS.—Secretary Taft has sent to Congress for introduction a bill providing for an increase and reorganization of the medical corps of the army. There has been some difference of opinion between the surgeon general and the General Staff as to the increase to be allowed, and Secretary Taft has framed a compromise bill, providing for an increase of 100 men, 200 majors and 300 captains and lieutenants.
