

INDIAN BILL PASSED.

Provision Authorizing Rental of Lands Stricken Out.

Washington, March 4.—The House today passed the Indian Appropriation bill after some controversy relative to provisions affecting tribes in the Indian Territory. An unsuccessful effort was made by Mr. Stephens, of Texas, to eliminate the provision for continuing the Dawes Commission another year.

The provision authorizing the renting of certain lands in the Indian Territory, which have been allotted to full blood Indians of a number of tribes, was stricken from the bill on a point of order. There was a spirited contest over the question of the maintenance of a warehouse at Omaha.

The provision authorizing and directing the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to make rules and regulations for the renting of the homesteads and surplus lands allotted to full blooded Indians belonging to the Cherokee, Creek, Choctaw and Chickasaw Indians in the Indian Territory or to the minor children of such Indians, went out on a point of order raised by Mr. Little. The bill was then passed without division.

A bill authorizing the construction of a bridge across the Wabash River in Vigo County, Ind., and another for the relief of certain settlers within the limits of the grant of land to the Atlantic and Pacific Railway Company, in New-Mexico, were passed.

EXCESSIVE GRAIN RATES CHARGED.

Washington, March 5.—George D. Henry, of Fairfield, Iowa, today with the Inter-State Commerce Commission a complaint alleging that the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad is imposing excessive and discriminating rates on grain and hay shipments in Kansas, Missouri, Iowa and other States.
