

PERDICARIS'S PERIL. Kidnappers Submit Terms Which Cannot Be Accepted.

Washington, May 28.—The kidnappers of Ion Perdicaris and his stepson, Varley, in Morocco, have submitted their terms for ransom, and the British minister has refused to accept them.

A long cable dispatch from Consul General Gurnea at Tangier was received by Secretary Hay to-day. It said in substance that Raisouli, the bandit who kidnapped Perdicaris and Varley, had been heard from, and made a set of demands which the British minister and Mr. Gurnea had deemed it their duty to lay before their governments.

The next step is in doubt. Admiral Chadwick will be at Tangier by to-morrow evening on the Brooklyn, to be followed in a day or two by the remainder of his fleet.

It is realized here that the French government, which, under its recent treaties with Great Britain, has secured a dominating influence in Morocco, naturally is rather nervous over any foreign interference in the affairs of that country.

Rear Admiral Jewell reported by cable to the British minister that he had received from the Egyptian squadron under his command, consisting of the Olympia, the Baltimore and the Cleveland, at the Atlantic coast, a report that the kidnappers had proceeded to Tangier.

The Navy Department has advised of the receipt of the report by the commander of the South Atlantic Squadron, from Tenerife for Tangier to join the Brooklyn. The stay of the Atlantic fleet in the Mediterranean will depend on conditions.

It is stated that the British minister has authorized to proceed on his cruise toward his station in the South Atlantic.

RECEPTION FOR BOLIVIAN MINISTER. Friendly Expressions Exchanged by Senor Calderon and President Roosevelt.

Washington, May 28.—Senor Don Ignacio Calderon, the new minister from Bolivia, on being presented to President Roosevelt to-day, spoke as follows:

I consider that my government has conferred upon me a great honor in appointing me its representative in the United States of America.

President Roosevelt replied as follows: It gives me pleasure to receive from your hands the letter whereby his excellency the President of Bolivia accredits you as envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary to the United States of America.

NOT TO STOP BALL GAME. But Evidence Will Be Obtained for a Test Case.

On the advice of District Attorney Clarke, in the wisdom of whose position the committee of ministers representing the organizations opposed to Sunday baseball has acquiesced, Deputy Police Commissioner Farrell will make no attempt to stop the championship baseball game between the Brooklyn and New-York teams scheduled for Washington Park this afternoon.

It was decided that considerable trouble might follow any interference with the game after twenty thousand or more persons had paid to see it. It has been agreed that the ministers are to have certain persons at the game to-day to gather evidence for a new test case.
