of the facts in the sculptor's professional career. It has its merits, but the author is too kind a critic. The most welcome of these four little publications, because freshest in interest, is Mr. F. L. Emanuel's contribution, "The Illustrators of Montmartre."

Mr. Andrew Lang has the third volume of his history of Scotland nearly ready. It covers the period from the death of James VI to that of Dundee in 1689. This date leaves the author with time and material for two or three more volumes before he reaches our own day.

Mrs. Ethel Clifford, the daughter of the novelist, will sustain the reputation she recently acquired among the clever minor poets of the day. Since she printed a collection of her verses in book form she has been contributing occasionally to the periodicals, and she continues to show, in these compositions, winning ideas and deft workmanship.

Under the title of "The Fall of Feudalism in Ireland" (Harper & Bros.) Mr. Michael Davitt has set forth at great length the story of the Land League Revolution. It is a serious study, but the narrative is amusingly lightened by a chapter of "Some League Anecdotes."
