Inspector General Usher Considered the Slocum Safe.
Washington, June 16.—George Usher, supervising inspector general of the United States steamboat inspection service, declares that so far as the Department of Commerce knows at present every safeguard that the law requires was thrown around the passengers of the ill-fated steamer General Slocum, and no provision or appliance for safety that could have been forced on the owners of the vessel under the present federal statutes was lacking.
It is crucial to attack the inspection service. The facts are known and negligence by the department is shown. So far as we have been able to learn up to this moment, the Slocum was provided with every piece of apparatus for fighting fire and every appliance for life saving that could be required. She had more than five hundred life boats, and she had more than the required number she was called upon to carry.
