

RUSSIAN LOSS OVER 1,000.

Eight hours overdue from New-Chwang, and is reported to have struck a mine. The vessel's agents cannot confirm this report, although they are inclined to believe it.

Tien-Tsin, July 18.—The Japanese have taken the steamer Hsiangping, recently captured, to Sasebo to await the action of the naval prize court. The captain of the Hsiangping has informed her owners that there is nothing of a contraband character on board, and the reason for her seizure is unknown.

MUST RETURN MAILS.

Germany Also Asks Russia to Disallow Action.

Berlin, July 18.—The German government has taken a prompt and firm stand in regard to the seizure of the mails of the North German Lloyd steamer Prinz Heinrich (which arrived at Aden on July 16 from Hamburg and Southampton for Yokohama) by the Russian volunteer fleet steamer Smolensk on July 15. The government has entered a protest against the carrying off of the mails, and has asked for a disavowal of the Smolensk's action and the return of the captured mail sacks. The German government, the Foreign Office says, recognizes the right to search mails when on board the vessel itself, but insists that the Smolensk had no right to take off mails in bulk from the vessel. The further argument is advanced that the right of search can be exercised only by a warship, whereas the Smolensk traversed the Dardanelles only recently flying the Russian commercial flag, not assuming the character of a warship. The German government has not taken a positive stand on this last point, but leaves the question for future discussion and settlement. No answer has yet been received from Russia.

Diplomatic circles believe that Russia will speedily disavow the seizure, since a refusal to take such action will certainly raise the question of the status of the Smolensk. Discussion of the incident among the foreign diplomats show that there is a belief that the raising of this question will be extremely awkward for Russia, since the Smolensk passed the Dardanelles as a merchantman and assumed the part of a warship in the Red Sea. In determining her status only two alternatives are permissible—she is either a warship or a pirate—and Russia, having every reason to prevent Germany from pressing for a decision on this point, will, it is believed, gracefully disavow the rash act of the Smolensk.

The newspapers strike a sharper note today in discussing the seizure of mails from the Prinz Heinrich and raise a unanimous demand for a speedy apology. The "Tageblatt" refers to the trial which the Prussian authorities began on July 12 at Königsberg, at the instance of the Russian government, against seven Social Democrats accused of smuggling anarchist literature into Russia, and says:

It is not a bad test of history that this infringement of international law should strike precisely that power which unmistakably reveals itself at Königsberg as a too subservient tool of Russian reaction and police arbitrariness.

The recent publication by the "Rues," of St. Petersburg, of a statement that Great Britain is about to transfer Wei-Hai-Wei to Germany in exchange for a free hand in the Yangtze Valley is scouted at the Foreign Office, where it is classed as a revival of an old story and as having no foundation.

PART OF MAIL RETURNED.

British Steamer Stopped and German Bags Transferred.

Aden, July 18.—The British steamer Persia was forcibly detained for an hour in the Red Sea by the Russian volunteer fleet steamer Smolensk, which transferred to the Persia part of the Japanese mails seized on the North German Lloyd steamer Prinz Heinrich on July 15. The Smolensk confiscated two bags of the Prinz Heinrich's mails destined for Nagasaki.

EARL PERCY ASKS DELAY.

Britain Investigating Russia's Action in Dardanelles.

London, July 18.—Earl Percy, Under Secretary for Foreign Affairs, in the House of Commons today asked General Laurier, Conservative and Unionist, to postpone until Thursday a question which he proposed to ask regarding the doings of the Russian volunteer fleet steamer St. Petersburg in the Red Sea.

The question, among other things, asked if it was in conformity with international law for a vessel to be transformed on the high seas to a merchantship to a warship, and whether a ship holding a commission as a warship should be commissioned as such in a port of the nation to which it belonged.

Earl Percy said that the matter was of the utmost importance, and was engaging the earnest attention of the government. As, however, the government's information was still incomplete on various points, the Under Secretary was not prepared to answer at present.

With reference to the seizure of the Peninsular and Oriental company's steamer Malacca, from Antwerp for Japan, by the Russian volunteer fleet steamer St. Petersburg, the owners say the only goods of a contraband nature on board, so far as they are aware, were consigned to the British naval dockyard at Hong Kong.

NO ALARM IN RUSSIA.

Foreign Office's Views of Trip of Black Sea Vessels.

St. Petersburg, July 18.—Russia does not foresee international complications on account of the passage of the volunteer fleet steamers through the Dardanelles and their subsequent conversion into cruisers. The framers of the Treaty of Paris, in seeking to close the Black Sea to the ingress and egress of Russian warships, evidently did not expect the present contingency. An official of the Foreign Office said today:

The St. Petersburg and the Smolensk did not pass the Dardanelles as warships, but as merchantmen. Under the Treaty of Paris there is no question of the right of ships to go on as merchantmen. With their subsequent conversion into warships Turkey has nothing to do. The treaty is silent on the subject.

The Admiralty has received reports of the seizure of the Peninsular and Oriental Company's steamer Malacca in the Red Sea by the German Lloyd steamer Prinz Heinrich by the North German Lloyd steamer Prinz Heinrich by the Smolensk, but nothing in regard to the stopping of the British steamer Walpara by the St. Petersburg. The Malacca had war munitions on board.

There is a prize court at Sebastopol and one at Libau. Whether an attempt will be made to take prizes into the Black Sea or into the Baltic has not been made known, although it is intimated that there is no obstacle in the way of sending them through the Dardanelles. Libau certainly is available. The precedents allowing unarmed Russian warships to pass the Dardanelles without protest from the signatories of the Treaty of Paris are considered valuable now.

While the diplomats here do not doubt the right of Russia to seize contraband of war, the confiscation of mails presents a different question.

JAPANESE SEIZE MAIL.

Letters Taken from Junk Tell Conditions at Fortress.

Tokyo, July 18.—The Japanese destroyer Haytor has captured a junk conveying mail from Port Arthur to Che-Foo. Letters dealing with military and naval conditions at Port Arthur have been seized and much valuable information has been obtained. The letters which did not deal with the military topics have been forwarded to St. Petersburg, with the request that they be delivered to those to whom they were addressed.

PORT ARTHUR SILENT.

Assault on Fortress Expected This Week—Steamer Missing.

Che-Foo, July 18.—No news has come out from Port Arthur recently, and the belief that the final assault will be made this week is growing. Newspaper correspondents are arriving here from Japanese and Chinese ports, and boats are ready to start for the fortress as soon as news of its fall is received.

BRITISH FLEET SAILS.

Mediterranean Warships Start for Alexandria.

London, July 19.—"The Daily Express" this morning prints the following dispatch, dated July 18, from its correspondent at Malta:

The British Mediterranean fleet left here today for Alexandria. It is believed that the destination of the fleet may be connected with the presence of the Russian volunteer fleet steamers in the Red Sea. The British cruiser Terrible is said to have sailed from Suez today for the purpose of looking after the interests of British merchantmen.

MORE VESSELS HELD UP.

Russian Captain Advises British Consuls to Look to Manifests.

London, July 19.—"The Daily Mail's" Aden correspondent says that the British steamers Woodcock and Dalmatia were held up by the Russians in the Red Sea and detained for three hours.

The correspondent adds that the captain of the Russian volunteer fleet steamer St. Petersburg has advised the British Resident at Aden to telegraph to the British consuls at Suez and Port Said that he would seize any British steamers bound for the Far East if the contents of their packages were not clearly shown on their manifests, according to international law.

"The Daily Mail's" St. Petersburg correspondent says that two more steamers of the Russian volunteer fleet now at Odessa have received confidential orders to leave this week for the Red Sea and to seize British vessels which are alleged to be carrying contraband of war.

NO PROTEST FROM COUNCIL.

Washington, July 18.—Regarding the report that Count Cassini, the Russian Ambassador, resented to the State Department a protest against the alleged intention of this government to dispatch a war squadron to Turkish waters to assist in the settlement of certain claims, it can be stated positively that no protest ever was made, and that the subject was discussed only in a friendly way by the Russian Ambassador with the Secretary of State.

ROOSEVELT'S GIFT TO SOCIETY.

Sends Picture of Himself to Sentinels of the Blessed Sacrament.

President Roosevelt has sent to the Sentinels of the Blessed Sacrament, a society of Catholic young men recruited from the Church of St. Jean-Baptiste, in East Seventy-sixth-st., a likeness of himself, bearing the following inscription:

I wish you all success as a society in your efforts to make our young upright and brave and generous countrymen stand in the strength, never wronging the weak.

The presentation of the portrait is the result of a visit to the President made by the moderator of the society, the Rev. Thomas Augustine Dwyer, Mr. Dwyer, in the course of his talk with the President, mentioned the society and told the President what its objects were.

INSURANCE PAID ON BALTIMORE FIRE.

Baltimore, Md., July 18.—The General Loss Committee, composed of expert insurance men, which was organized shortly after the great fire of February 7, has today issued its final report to the Chairman Paul Turner. The report states that 2,735 separate claims were handled by the committee, and that the amount of insurance paid on these claims was \$2,945,383. There are still eleven claims unsettled, and in addition there were probably about 1,000 or 1,200 smaller claims which were settled by the committee. The total amount involved in these small claims will not exceed \$1,669,000, so that the total insurance paid to those who lost in the fire will be about \$2,500,000.

ROSEBUD RUSH, INCREASES.

THE WEATHER REPORT.

Official Record and Forecast.—Washington, July 18.—The barometric conditions have not changed appreciably in the last twenty-four hours. The weather warmer that set in Sunday continues east of the Rocky Mountains, the maximum temperatures being above 90 degrees in all districts except in New-England and the north-east last night.

The highest maximum temperature of the day, 98 degrees, occurred at Lynchburg, Va. No rain of consequence fell in any part of the country, except along the Gulf Coast and in Eastern New-York, New-Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Continued high temperatures will prevail Tuesday and Wednesday in the interior valleys, and thence eastward to the Atlantic. Local rains are probable in New-England for the lake region, the upper Ohio Valley and along the Gulf Coast.

The cooling afforded by these showers will be only temporary. The winds along the Atlantic Coast will be light to fresh from the east and south-east, and along the Great Lakes, fresh west to south-west.

Steamers departing Tuesday for European ports will have light to fresh easterly winds and fair weather to the Grand Banks.

Forecast for Special Localities.—For Eastern New-York, Eastern Pennsylvania, New-Jersey and Delaware, fair and warm to-day and Wednesday; light, variable winds.

For District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia, fair and warm to-day and Wednesday; light, variable winds.

PARKER, HILL, SHEEHAN.

A Man Is Known by the Company He Keeps.

To the Editor of The Tribune.

Sir: It is inconceivable that the people of the State of New-York who are familiar with the political career of David B. Hill and William F. Sheehan, these representatives of the worst type of politics in the history of our State, should in their sober moments think of giving their votes for the highest office in the land to a man who has had no experience in public affairs other than a creditable service on the bench, and whose candidacy had its inception in the minds of Hill and Sheehan, with a view to restoring them to popular favor, which they had lost by their connection with the "steal of the State Senator from the Columbia-Dutchess district in 1891," the snap or anti-Cleveland convention in 1892, and the appointment of Judge Maynard to fill a vacancy on the Court of Appeals in 1892, and the disastrous attempt to elect him to the office of Governor in 1893. In view of the prominence of these men and their close connection with the operations of Judge Parker as a candidate for the Presidency, would not some of the editorials in "The New-York Evening Post" and "The New-York Times" in the year 1885, when Hill was elected Governor and Alton B. Parker was chairman of the executive committee, prove interesting reading? This was the celebrated campaign when the contractors building the Croton Aqueduct contributed so largely to Hill's election, and their notes were negotiated by Parker and others.

The editorials in these same papers in the years 1891, 1892 and 1893 would also throw light on the present situation, in the fall of 1891 Hill and Sheehan and Judge Maynard were important factors in the steal of the Columbia-Dutchess Senatorial seat. Notwithstanding Maynard's connection with these infamous proceedings, he was appointed by the Democratic Governor to a seat on the Court of Appeals in 1892, and when a candidate before the people in 1896 for the same office was beaten by about 100,000. While Alton B. Parker advocated Maynard's elevation to the Court of Appeals bench, the New-York Bar Association openly repudiated Maynard's nomination and with the aid of the leading Democratic lawyers throughout the State encompassed the end of Maynard and Maynardism. Hill, in the fall of 1894, when a candidate for Governor, was beaten by a majority of 150,000. From that time to the inception of Judge Parker's candidacy, Hill and Sheehan have been in political retirement, with the exception of the time when Hill was winding up his term in the Senate.

It is not my purpose to inquire whether Judge Parker, who has been on the bench since he was twenty-six years old, having been elected Surrogate in 1872, and serving in such position until his appointment to a position on the Supreme Court by David B. Hill, within a few weeks of Judge Parker's services as chairman of the executive committee of the Democratic State Committee, and going from the Supreme Court to the Court of Appeals, has or has not that kind of training and experience that fits him for the Presidency, but it is to call attention, in view of some of the hysteria and gush circulated about his "heroic" telegram, to the forces and interests he has been aligned with in the politics of the State, and to ask whether the stream can run higher than the fountain head.

In view of his having twice supported Bryan when thousands of the best Democrats in our State repudiated him, including his colleague on the Court of Appeals—Judge John Clinton Gray—it is not a natural inference that the leopard will not change his spots, and that Parker, if elected, would be under the baneful influence of Hill and Sheehan?
