

CALL ON NATIONAL BANKS.

Secretary Shaw Asks for 25 Per Cent of Government Deposits.

Washington, Nov. 18.—Secretary Shaw has announced a call on national banks holding government deposits, to the amount of 25 per cent on or before January 15 next and 15 per cent on or before March 15 next. The Secretary estimates that the total amount of government deposits held by the national banks is approximately \$500,000,000. The call includes all banks except a few active depositors, where the amount of the deposit is relatively small, as compared with the amount of business handled for the government.

Secretary Shaw's call caused little comment here, as it had been generally understood that he intended to withdraw about \$25,000,000 of the government deposits soon after the first of the year. Last week's bank statement gave \$23,389,300 as the amount of the government deposits held by the local depository banks, so that the sum to be called on would amount to about \$21,600,000. However, many of the interior depository banks keep their government holdings in deposit here, a large part of the 25 per cent called for will be drawn from this center.
