OISEAU FAILS DISMALLY.

OXFORD WINS BROADWAY.

Great American for Harry Payne Whitney's Burgomaster.

Oiseau, the snug little chestnut colt which last fall galloped his way so far into the hearts of racing folk that he was placed on a pedestal and proclaimed the coming three-year-old champion...

According to the conditions of the stake, both Oiseau and Captain Sam Brown's Agile were compelled to take up five pound penalties, which made their impetus 121 pounds. So much did Oiseau weigh that he was in a field of five of his contemporaries...

In the opinion of a majority of the critics his trainer had him keyed up to racing pitch, and there could be no excuse for him on the score of lack of condition. George Odum had the mount, and after getting away from the post nicely, placed him where he wanted, behind the pace, and apparently bided his time...

In the next fifty yards the half-harrowing to a vast majority became apparent that Oiseau was beaten—hopelessly beaten. Odum conceded it a second later, when he put up his whip, with which he had been bluffing the colt, and ceased to ride. Oxford went on and won from Agile in 1:48, fast enough time in itself, but not fast enough to count for Oiseau's defeat...

In addition to the Broadway Stakes, the Brooklyn Jockey Club offered the Empire State Steeplechase Handicap and the Great American Stakes, and these features, coupled with the first appearance of Oiseau, brought out a bumper crop of spectators.




