

ALL RUSSIA IN UNREST. SIGNS OF COMING STORM.

Efforts to Organize General Strike—Moscow Turbulent.

St. Petersburg, March 21.—The unrest among the Russian workmen is growing. It is largely due to the government's repressive measures in the provinces, and especially to the threatening situation in the Don and other regions. At Ekaterinav 16,000 men of the Hughes Iron Works are already reported to have struck, and at Moscow great agitation prevails in the industrial sections. The movement is connected with the demand of the Social Democrats and revolutionists for another general political strike.

The government organ, "Gosudarstvo," prints a dispatch from Moscow to-day, saying that Jewish merchants and their families are leaving that city in haste owing to fears of a Jewish massacre at Easter. At Theodosia, in the Crimea, a crowd broke into a synagogue and destroyed the altar and the religious emblems and pictures. The Department of Posts and Telegraphs has announced that concerted efforts are being made in various parts of the country again to organize a union of the employees of that department. The former Editor of the Jewish paper "Novost," to imprisonment for one year in a fortress. The principal count in the indictment was based upon the reproduction in the "Novost" of a speech by Herr Behel, the German socialist leader.

The "Nasha Shisn" to-day asserts that the Minister of the Interior has ordered the censors not to pass dispatches containing adverse election news.

Moscow, March 21.—In view of the agitation among the workmen, owing to the efforts to bring about another general strike, the railroad stations here are armed with rifles.

Bobrinsk, Province of Minsk, March 21.—Eight out of thirteen soldiers who were condemned to death here for mutiny have escaped with the aid of revolutionists.

Reval, March 21.—Six Letts implicated in the murder of Baron von Baranoff have been tried by military court martial and sentenced to be hanged. A number of others have already been acquitted.

Ekaterinav, March 21.—The police to-day surrounded the house of a man named Goldman, suspected of being a revolutionist. Goldman resisted arrest, and he and his wife were shot dead and their servant was mortally wounded.

THE MOSCOW BANK ROBBERY. Attack Reported Organized by the Revolutionary Committee.

St. Petersburg, March 21.—The "Novoye Vremya" account of the robbery of the Credit Mutual, the robbers getting \$432,500, says that the vaults were open and that several employees were present when the twenty bandits entered. The men were armed with bombs as well as six revolvers. Their leader announced that he came in the name of the revolutionary committee which needed money, promising that the employees of the bank would not be harmed unless they raised an outcry. If they did so, he would blow up the establishment with bombs, saying, "We are desperate and not afraid to die."

While the bandits were at work one man stood with a lighted fuse near a powerful bomb which had been placed on a table, ready to be exploded if such a step became necessary. The telephone was disconnected, and when the bandits had completed their work the employees of the bank were warned that if they gave an alarm within fifteen minutes after the departure of the band a bomb would be thrown through the windows.

NO MUTINY AT SEBASTOPOL. City Reported Quiet—Schoolboys Strike Owing to Schmidt's Execution.

St. Petersburg, March 21.—The reports current here last night that a mutiny of sailors had broken out at Sebastopol were unfounded. The correspondent of The Associated Press at Sebastopol telegraphs that all is quiet there.

Osaka, March 21.—As protest against the execution of Lieutenant Schmidt, leader of the naval mutiny at Sebastopol last November, the pupils of all the local high schools struck to-day.

THE OREGON NEEDS REPAIRS. Rumors of Structural Weakness The Battleship at Honolulu. Honolulu, March 21.—The battleship Oregon, which is returning to Bremerton for repairs, has arrived here from the Orient. For some time it is understood there has been an order not to use the 13-inch guns except in case of necessity. The Oregon will probably sail for San Francisco on March 25.

RIGHTS OF DOUMA FEW. AUTOCRACY PROTECTED. Little Chance for Russians to Over-ride Will of Czar. St. Petersburg, March 21.—The imperial manifesto and the ukase of March 8, which incorporate in the fundamental law of the empire the provisions for a national assembly in Russia, are disappointing in many respects. They constitute neither a constitution nor a bill of rights for the Russian people. They do create a popular assembly, but the powers granted to it are so hedged with restrictions and conditions that it will be rather a parliament in name than in fact. Nevertheless, by the terms of the manifesto, the Emperor himself is powerless to revoke what he has now given. This constitutes the great victory which the people have won. They at last have a medium through which they can make their voice heard, and it is in this assembly probably that the great struggle against prerogative and privilege will be fought out.

CHINESE LABOR IN TRANSVAAL. House Rejects Mr. Chamberlain's Motion for Royal Commission. London, March 21.—The House of Commons rejected to-day by 378 to 110 votes a motion of Joseph Chamberlain recommending the appointment of a royal commission to inquire into the economic and moral effect of Chinese labor in the Transvaal.

FIGHT SEA AND HUNGER. Sailors Float Days in Small Boat—Three Fishermen Lost. Boston, March 21.—Captain Henry Smith, of the schooner Adeline, and his five men, who, in a jollyboat, weathered the gale and violent snowstorm of last week after having been compelled to abandon their unseaworthy vessel, and who were rescued by the fishing schooner Margaret Dillon after they had been seventy-two hours without food or drink, were landed here to-day by the Dillon. The Adeline was abandoned on Friday off Duck Island, on the coast of Maine, waterlogged and without sails. The crew, besides the captain, the mate, the steward and three of the crew.

A PROTECTIVE TARIFF IN JAPAN. Higher Duties on Flour and Leather—A Retaliatory Clause. London, March 22.—The Daily Telegraph's Tokyo correspondent explains the Diet as a protection measure.
