

MURDERED BY BURGLARS.

Constable Killed After Battle in Bank—Three Men Arrested.

Rochester, March 23.—Edward Pullman, a constable and night watchman, at Sodus, was murdered early this morning by burglars who were discovered by him while in the act of rifling the Knapp Bank of that village. Three men believed to be implicated in the murder were arrested here this afternoon.

The burglars first visited the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg railway depot, where they blew open the large safe, stole a small safe and ransacked the express packages. They secured only a small amount of money. Then they went to the Knapp Bank. They were engaged in drilling a hole in the safe when discovered by Pullman.

Although five men were engaged in the job Pullman fearlessly entered the bank and gave battle. A fusillade of shots followed, during which the constable was instantly killed by a bullet passing through his right lung.

After the shooting the robbers fled, leaving the drill in the safe. When Pullman did not reach home at the usual time this morning the family became alarmed and a search was made, but it was not until two hours later that Charles C. Field, a bank employe, found the body.

Of the three men arrested this afternoon in a rooming house on State street one gave his name as James Schultz, another as James McCormick, while the third, who has a bullet wound in his leg, refused to give his name or tell anything about himself. The police, however, have identified him as "Big Bill" Kelly, of Boston, who is regarded as one of the most notorious and desperate bank robbers in the country.

Detectives have searched the rooms where the three men were arrested, and found dynamite, a complete set of burglar's tools, jammers, drills, etc., wet gloves, and a soft hat in which there were two bullet holes.

As the man whose name has been identified as the notorious "Big Bill" Kelly, of Boston, has a bullet wound in the leg, and as the hat has two bullet holes, the presumption is that Pullman put up a desperate fight before he was killed.

Boston, March 23.—Chief Inspector William Wais of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation said today that he did not recall any person as "Big Bill" Kelly, mentioned as one of the alleged bank robbers and murderers arrested at Rochester today, but that he knew a "Big Eddie" Kelly. The latter, he said, is a notorious criminal and bank burglar, who has served several terms in the Massachusetts state prison.
