TRADE IN CHICAGO.

(By Telegraph to The Tribune.)

Chicago, April 7.—Wheat played "second fiddle" to corn and oats to-day. Business in the coarse grains was active and was to the accompaniment of strongly advancing prices. At the end wheat showed a net gain of ¼c for May, while corn was from ¼c to ½c higher than it left off the day before. Oats had an advance of ¼c for May and ¼c to ½c for July. Provisions renewed their recent limited advance, and at the close were at their best for the day, 10c higher for pork, from 10c to 25c for lard and from 10c to 15c higher for ribs.

Indications of heavy rain in the West before Monday gave a stimulus to the corn market, and trade was broad and active. The bullish sentiment was helped by heavy sales for shipment at the opening of navigation, the light movement from the country and prospects of a large decrease in local stocks. Receipts were 156 cars, with 159 cars estimated for Monday. Shipments hence were 129,000 bushels. The market gained strength as the session progressed, and was at its best as the market was closing. May closed at 49½c and July at 49c. The market for oats was active and firm. The same news that affected the corn market influenced oats. Local receipts were 112 cars, with 153

cars estimated for Monday. Shipments hence were 112,000 bushels. May oats closed at 31½c to 31¾c and July at 29½c to 30c.

Provisions showed considerable strength. The excellent cash demand, as reflected in the heavy shipments of meats and lard, stimulated bullish feeling. May pork opened at \$16.20, sold up to \$16.2½, and eased off to the former price. May lard sold from \$8.42½ to \$8.47½, and eased off to \$8.45. May ribs sold from \$8.60 up to \$8.65. Hog receipts were 12,000 head, and prices at the yards were a shade higher.

PENNSYLVANIA COMPANY'S REPORT.

In the annual report of the Pennsylvania Company, the corporation which manages in the interest of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company the railroads leased and controlled by the latter company west of Pittsburg, A. J. Cassatt, the president, says, in part:

The income account of the company shows a large gain in gross earnings, reflecting the prosperous conditions prevailing in the territory tributary to the system, and net earnings were \$2,557,456, an increase of \$1,294,587. The gross income of the company was \$16,342,450, an increase of \$6,064,621. There were paid out of this amount, in addition to contributions to sinking funds aggregating \$322,163, the sum of \$1,334,990, the amount of certificates of gold loan of 1901, drawn November 5, 1905, and a dividend of 5 per cent upon the capital stock, leaving a balance of \$2,288,297. From this amount there was transferred to the fund for extraordinary expenditures the sum of \$2,000,000 to provide for future betterments not properly chargeable to capital account, and the balance of \$288,297 was transferred to the credit of profit and loss account. There were increases in expenses in all depart-

Heavy expenditures were necessary upon the Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Pittsburg which was opened late in the year by connecting the Mahoning Valley Western with the Cleveland & Pittsburg, near Ravenna, and the Pittsburg, Youngstown & Ashabuta, near Niles. The new route is a low grade freight line. The report continues:

No further redemption could be made of the bonds of the \$20,000,000 4½ per cent issue, so the amount outstanding remained \$19,467,000. Of the 3½ per cent guaranteed trust certificates, series A, \$25,000 were retired, reducing the amount outstanding to \$4,515,000. Of the series B certificates \$106,000 were retired, leaving \$5,581,000 outstanding. Of the series C certificates \$52,000 were redeemed, leaving \$4,549,000 outstanding. General mortgage bonds of the Erie & Pittsburg Railroad to the amount of \$42,000 were redeemed, leaving \$1,458,000 outstanding.
