BROOKLYN RECTOR GOES. Dr. R. F. Alsop Gives Reason for Leaving St. Ann's.

As a sequence to an article that appeared lately, announcing the resignation of the rectorship of St. Ann's Church, Brooklyn, by the Rev. Dr. R. F. Alsop, and his plan to make a tour of the world, we print below his letter to the vestry of St. Ann's and their action thereupon.

At a meeting of the vestry of St. Ann's Church, held June 13, the rector presented the following: A little more than twenty years ago St. Ann's Church asked me to become its rector. In accepting the position I made it my duty to make a tour of the world...

I therefore herewith present to you my resignation of the rectorship of the parish, to take effect on the first of July next. In taking this step I desire to express my deep appreciation and thankfulness for the cordial and generous support which you have always rendered to me...

Six Motormen Arrested on Complaint of Automobilists. (By Telegraph to The Tribune.) Middletown, N. Y., June 29.—A tie-up of the entire system of the Walkill Transit Company, operating trolley cars in this city and Goshen, was threatened this afternoon when the superintendent and six motormen were arrested for violating the speed law. The police have been very active in arresting automobile owners for speeding, and they "kicked" because the trolley cars were violating the law with impunity.

MOTORMAN'S BAIL KEPT HIGH. Coroner, Despite Protests, Holds Bodischer in \$20,000 for the Grand Jury. Coroner Harburger continued to break precedents at the inquest into the deaths of Teresa and Josefina Calogino yesterday. The children were run down and killed by a streetcar at Avenue A and 12th street on June 15, and he then held the motorman, Herman Bodischer, in the extraordinary sum of \$20,000. In spite of the protests of counsel for the New York City Railway Company, representing Bodischer, Coroner Harburger held the motorman for the amount of the grand jury, and continued the bail at the same large figure. Bodischer could not give the security and went back to the Tombs.
