

A STAKE FOR SHOT GUN.

WINS BAY SHORE EASILY.

Big Fields Have No Terrors for Racing Folk at Gravesend.

Seven races were decided at Gravesend yesterday, and a big crowd of some ten thousand spectators went to the track in the belief that they could pick winners and play them in the large and generally fields that went to the post. Strange to say, they were more than usually successful, as three favorites and two well placed second choices got home in front, while Fantastic and Prudential Girl, the other winners, had plenty of followers. The sport was not of an exciting nature, as with one exception the winners were so much the best in their respective races that they won as they pleased, and there was lacking the thrill of close and hard fought finishes.

The Bay Shore Stakes, a selling affair, was the only feature on the programme, and shot gun was little trouble in winning. As good as 2 to 1 was laid against his chances, although with only 130 pounds up he looked like a legitimate 1 to 2 shot. In the handicap he would have had to carry at least 125 pounds, but this appeared to be forgotten, and Rye, Deutschland and Quadrille were all played to beat him. The price against shot gun looked too good to be true to astute speculators, and the result was that they did not wager, thinking that something must have happened to him. These kicked themselves mentally after the race was well under way, as the big sprinter had Deutschland into submission rounding the turn, and drew away to win galloping by two or three lengths. Rye caught Deutschland turning for home, and went on after shot gun in a tight stem chase. He hung just at the end, however, as if he needed a race, and Keator, doing with a rush on the rail, beat him a head to the place.

The handicap, at one mile and a sixteenth, for all ages, furnished the best race of the day. Martin Boyal, with Miller up, was the favorite, with Don Royal quickly backed from 6 to 1 to 1 by those who remembered his good performance a few days ago and knew that he had been a runner also, but the others were more or less neglected at long prices.

Don Royal was in ugly mood at the post, but when the barrier was released he broke running and secured the coveted position on the rail. He rushed to the first turn. Vendor raced with the first two furlongs, and when he dropped back, he was overtaken by the other two. He was beaten by the latter shot him off when Williams drew his whip, and seemed quite willing to accept Martin Boyal's challenge in the last sixteenth, and proved able to withstand it and win in a hard drive by a length. Martin Boyal ran a good race under his heavy impost, and but for some interference on the turn might have been closer up, although he could hardly have beaten the winner, who showed clearly that he was back to his best form. DECIDE ON THE SOYA.

Little Yacht Will Meet Boston Boat for Challenge Cup.

W. A. Barstow's Class Q sloop, the Soya, was chosen last night, after the final elimination race had been called in the afternoon off the Atlantic Yacht Club, to meet the Orestes, the champion of that class in Massachusetts Bay, which is owned by Caleb Loring, of the Boston Yacht Club, and which will be sailed here by Charles Francis Adams, 2d, who sailed the Auk in the German-American races of Marblehead.

The selection was made by a special committee composed of R. P. Doremus and Theodore Wells, of the Atlantic Yacht Club, and R. V. R. Spielder, of the New York Canoe Club. The Soya, which was the winner of yesterday's race, she defeated the Orestes by 2 minutes 26 seconds, elapsed time, over a five and one-half mile course, but in the six trial races that have been sailed the Soya has won two, and has shown herself to be such a good boat in heavy weather, that the committee chose her.

The races are to be sailed to-morrow, Friday and Saturday over courses outside Coney Island. The Soya was designed by Clinton H. Crane, who will sail her in the races for the challenge cup offered by Commodore Reid.

ROADS FOR ART EXHIBITION IN LONDON.

Work Has Been Delayed by Inability to Find Fireproof Galleries. William T. Evans, the well-known collector, gave out a statement last night regarding a movement for the encouragement of American art started by the Society of Art Collectors, of which the president is J. H. Rhoades, president of the Greenwich Savings Bank. In this movement, as told in the Tribune some time ago, there are associated with Mr. Rhoades Andrew Carnegie, Charles Stewart Smith, William T. Evans, H. W. Ranger, George A. Hearn, H. R. Wilson, Dr. A. C. Humphreys and Samuel Untermyer. It was proposed to hold an exhibition in the spring of 1907 in London, of the work of American artists, presenting 100 or 125 paintings.

A special feature was to be a portrait of President Roosevelt by a representative American artist, and if the artist was well received it was to be presented to royalty. Mr. Evans's statement follows: Members of the Society of Art Collectors have been anxious to hold this exhibition in London next spring, but we have been afraid we could not find galleries sufficiently fireproof, but we have recently
