Current Talk About Things Present and to Come.

Mrs. Elizabeth Robins Pennell's biography of her uncle, Charles Godfrey Leland, popularly known as Hans Breitmann, is announced for publication next week by Houghton, Mifflin & Co. Leland entered Princeton College in 1841, when he was seventeen years old, and at a time when he says, "The college was simply a mathematical school, run on old school Presbyterian principles."

Professor A. V. Williams Jackson's "Persia Past and Present," which the Macmillan Company is bringing out this week, is largely the outcome of the author's travels, observations and personal experiences in the country. He relates what he actually saw as interpreted by the knowledge gained through his long continued studies of Persian history and archeology.

"Old Chester," the imaginary town which Mrs. Margaret Deland has invented for purposes of fiction, is to have a realization in fact. A tract of a thousand acres in New Jersey near the Orange Mountains has been acquired by a group of people of literary tastes and activities, who hope to establish there an ideal colony, to be modeled after an old English village and to be known as Old Chester.

Under the title of "A Sailor of Fortune," McClure, Phillips & Co. are issuing this week a volume of memoirs of Captain B. S. Osborn, written by Albert Bigelow Paine. Captain Osborn is a seafaring man, who has led a varied and adventurous life. He took part in the war against the Chinese pirates, served at Fort Sumter and with Farragut in the Civil War, fought as a volunteer in the war with Spain and has been associated with many notable personages under many unusual circumstances.

Two volumes designed for the guidance of collectors and the means of artistic homes are the Frederick A. Stokes Company's list for publication in October, "In Decorative Styles and Periods." Mrs. Helen Churchill Candee presents a study of the sequence of styles as one would succeed by another from antiquity through the Renaissance down to the present day. In "The Collector's Manual" Mr. N. Hudson Moore aims to supply information by means of which amateur collectors may be able to choose what is good and be aided in detecting what is fraudulent.

From Henry Holt & Co. comes the announcement of a volume entitled "Panama and the Panama Canal," the work of Dr. Willis Fletcher Johnson, author of "A Century of Expansion," and now and for many years an editorial writer on the Tribune. In his present book Dr. Johnson aims to give for the first time a complete history of the four centuries of canal agitation and attempted realization. The author has been a close student of interesting canal projects since De Lesseps's first disastrous attempt on the isthmus, and writes with the authority of a personal observer. The book is dedicated to Secretary Taft, in whose company Dr. Johnson lately made a visit to Panama to inspect the progress of the enterprise.

H. G. Wells's novel, "In the Days of the Comet," will be published here immediately by the Century Company. It is a romance of the future in the author's familiar style, descriptive of the great "Change" which is to bring about the Utopia which has been the dream of the world in all ages, and which has been especially agitating the mind of Mr. Wells.

A religio-historical novel of the days of Christ, entitled "Under Pontius Pilate," is announced for publication next month by Funk & Wagnalls. The author, William Schuyler, is a new writer, who is said to approach his subject in an "up-to-date and rather daring way."

By way of preparation for writing his forthcoming book, "On the Trail of the Immigrant," Mr. Edward A. Steiner assumed the garb and personality of one of the class with which his volume is concerned. He has made the journey from Europe to America in the steerage, not once, but many times. He has lived with the peasants of Poland and the Balkans, has been herded with them on European trains and has even accompanied them to their destinations in America, and has worked with them in Pennsylvania coal mines and in Wisconsin forests. His experiences cover a great part of the last twenty years. The volume will be published next month by the Fleming H. Revell Company.

"Marcel Levisnet," the new novel by Elysa Barron, which Duffield & Co. will publish next week, is described as a romance of modern Paris, with a strong detective interest. The hero, from whom the book takes its title, is a kind of French Sherlock Holmes, whose marvellous genius for unravelling mysteries leads him into many lively adventures.

Russell Sturgis's "History of Architecture" will be published in England by B. T. Batsford, through arrangement with the Baker & Taylor Company.

A collection of eight humorous short stories by Mr. Ellis Parker Butler, the author of "Figs in Pigs," is to be brought out shortly by Herbert B. Turner & Co. Its title will be "Perkins of Portland; Perkins the Great." Another new book by the same author, to be called "The Incubator Baby," is on the fall list of Funk & Wagnalls.

A new novel of American life, by Ralph D. Paine, author of "The Praying Skipper," has just been brought out by the Gutter Publishing Company. It is called "The Story of Martin Coo."

A recent addition to the series of "Ecclectic Readings," published by the American Book Company, is "Half Hours with Fishes, Reptiles and Birds," by Charles Frederick Holder, the well known naturalist and sportsman.

Whittier's "Snow-Drift" will be issued next week by Houghton, Mifflin & Co. in a special holiday edition. The poem will be printed from new plates, and each page will carry a head-piece and a tail-piece in tint from designs by Adrian J. Iorio. There will be a frontispiece in colors by John J. Enneking, and nineteen other illustrations, including drawings by Howard Pyle and E. H. Garrett.

Professor A. V. Williams Jackson's Book on PERSIA Past and Present A BOOK OF TRAVEL AND RESEARCH

By A. V. WILLIAMS JACKSON Professor of Indo-Iranian Languages, Sometime Adjunct Professor of the English Language and Literature in Columbia University, Author of "Zoroaster, The Prophet of Ancient Iran."

This account of Professor Williams Jackson's recent journey by caravan may be read either as an unusually interesting book of modern travel through an unfamiliar country, or as an important contribution to our knowledge of the present life of the people of Persia and their history. The author's route carried him from the Caucasus mountains on the north nearly to the Persian Gulf on the south, across the Yezd, in the central desert, and back northward to Teheran and the Caspian Sea. His experiences are well told and profusely illustrated from more than two hundred fine photographs, and a map.

TO FIGHT NUISANCES. Staten Island League Names Committees for Crusade.

At a meeting of the Anti-Nuisance League of Staten Island, the following committees were appointed under the constitution of the league, to deal with the various nuisances. At the same time Captain William Delehanty, governor of Sailors' Snug Harbor, was made the twelfth member of the council, leaving only three vacancies to be filled to complete the roster.

On ferries—Arthur Kavanagh, cashier of the National City Bank; Edward W. Brown and Howard R. Handy.

On steam railroads—B. T. Kearns, proprietor of the Hotel Caspian; Gaston Harby and F. F. Hecl on trolleys—D. J. Bardwell, superintendent of the public school system in Richmond Heights; Norman S. Walker, Jr. and John B. Pearson.

On factories and other industrial plants—Captain Daniel Delehanty, governor of Sailors' Snug Harbor; William G. Willcox and Edward A. C. Knothe.

On gas, electricity, telephone and telegraph services—J. G. Timolat, president of the State Club; Walter L. Clark and A. C. Knothe.

On public order, comfort and decency, which includes the operation of the police, street cleaning, fire, health, etc.—Rev. F. W. Crowder, rector of Christ Church, Staten Island; George J. Benziger and F. M. Sealander.
