

SALVIDERE A CHAMPION KING OF TWO-YEAR-OLDS.

Earns the Right and Title by Impressive Victory at Gravesend.

WHAT SALVIDERE HAS EARNED IN WINNING SIX OUT OF SEVEN RACES.

Salvidere is king. He earned the right and title to the two-year-old honors of the season by winning the Junior Champion Stakes at Gravesend yesterday in a way to leave no doubt in the minds of those who saw his brilliant performance as to his superiority over the other youngsters of his age.

In spite of the leaden skies and drizzling rain a crowd of some fifteen thousand persons made the journey to the track, and with all the discomforts that followed being herded together in the comparatively small grandstand, not one there was who did not go home well satisfied with having seen the two-year-old championship decided.

The Junior Championship Stakes was for two-year-olds over the short six furlong course, and had a gross value of something over \$15,000. The stake in this particular instance was apportioned, as six horses went to the post worthy to fight for the rich prize and the title that victory meant.

The start was prompt and good, but De Mund and Salvidere drew away from the others so quickly in the first quarter that the race settled down to a duel between the two. The flashy De Mund had all his great speed, and showed the way up the backstretch and around the turn by a full three lengths.

Salvidere raced up to him, however, turning for home, without apparent effort, and after a short but decisive battle came again, to win galloping by two lengths.
