

BRIDGE TRAFFIC WORSE. President Winter Says City Will Have Big Problem to Solve.

Edwin W. Winter, president of the Brooklyn Rapid Transit system, declared at the meeting yesterday of the Rapid Transit Commission that the city within four years "would have to face a condition of transportation that it never dreamed of."

"The increase in traffic on our lines," he said, "within the last four years has been 16 per cent a year, and last year we carried 150,000,000 passengers one way."

President Orr suggested that relief might be obtained by means of ferries. Mr. Winter nodded assent, but declared the people did not like to pay a second fare.

"Did you find out last summer that the people object to paying more than one fare?" Mr. Winter asked Mr. Winter, but made no reply.
