MILK COST QUESTION. COMMITTEES AT WORK. Pasturization and Inspection Favoured by Different Sides.

In the struggle for pure milk for this city it has come down to a question of the cost to the dairymen, handlers and consumers. It is certain that a large percentage of the consumers are willing to pay more for their supply if its purity is guaranteed.

The philanthropic element in this contest is busy getting figures to show that pasturization as a sanitary enterprise will not be more expensive than inspection. Dr. Thomas Darlington, the Health Commissioner, has had practical assurance from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment that he will get the \$250,000 necessary to increase his corps of inspectors to the efficient number.

The committee on the preservation of the herds of the Charity Organization Society has sent out a statement giving figures regarding the cost to the dairymen during the last year in the elimination of tuberculous cattle. This committee comprises among its members Dr. Thomas Darlington, the Health Commissioner, Dr. Hermann M. Biggs, the medical adviser of the Board of Health, Dr. L. H. Holt, bacteriologist and pathological expert, Dr. A. Jacoby, Dr. E. G. Janeway and Dr. Lederer.

There are approximately 11,000 carcasses of beef and 5,000 carcasses of hogs condemned each year by the federal inspectors in this city as tuberculous. We should not be far wrong in estimating the loss on these carcasses at present prices as about \$1,000,000. In the case of the hogs, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, we should therefore have as the net result of the loss of these carcasses a total of \$1,200,000. This statement, however, does not include the 470 carcasses of hogs which it was necessary last year to condemn for the same cause, and the approximate value of which is not mentioned.
