### THE KAISER'S SERMON.

His Majesty Makes a Powerful Plea for Prayer.

It will be recalled, says "The London Telegraph," that the German Emperor on one occasion preached a sermon on board his yacht, the Hohenzollern, taking as his text: "It came to pass, when Moses held up his hand, that Israel prevailed, and when he let down his hand Amalek prevailed—Exodus xvii, 11."

An English translation of this sermon, published in the "Homiletic Review" for July, shows to be a powerful plea for the habit of prayer. We quote the following passage from this memorable sermon of the Kaiser:

"God, the Lord, has hung in every heart a ringing bell. Yet, how often in the sunshine of life it is silent and dumb! But when the storm of trouble comes it begins to ring. How many a comrade who had forgotten how to pray let his hands once more out there in the death struggle! Necessity teaches prayer. So it is here at home. Let the serious days which have come upon us, the storm of war which has broken out, set the prayer bells swinging again. Let us pray for our fighting soldiers. Not only now and then in a solemn hour; no, no! Let us pray constantly.

"As our fathers in troublous times set the bells ringing every evening, and at the sound uncovered their heads and prayed: 'Lord Jesus Christ, with us abide, for it is now eventide,' so let us never forget our prayers. Moses held up his hands until the sun went down, and so Joshua with Amalek with the sword. Our fight will not be ended in a day. But let us not allow our hands to grow weary, nor let them sink until victory is gained. Let our prayers be a wall of fire around our brothers' camp.

"The history of the world will some day write the wars of our day. But man only sees what is visible to the eye; he can only say what the wisdom of generals, the bravery of troops, the sharpness of weapons have accomplished. Eternity will reveal much more. It will show how the hidden prayers of the faithful were a mighty power in these battles, how the ancient promise was again fulfilled, 'Call upon Me in the time of trouble, and I will save thee.' And, therefore, hold fast to prayer. Amen."

### MORAL EDUCATION OF THE WORLD.

Like an individual, a nation has a mind and a conscience, and it has them in a very real sense. As politicians and statesmen have long since found out, the term Puritan conscience in America, Non-Conformist conscience in England, French spirit and German idealism on the Continent, are not names for empty abstractions; but they stand in each case for what is terribly real. One of the chief problems of our time is to bring the nations' mind and the nations' consciences to bear on the moral problems involved in international relations. This is a step in the moral education of the world. It carries with it no necessary criticism upon what has gone before, and no aspersion upon what
