GOMPERS MEETS A. F. L. OFFICERS.

A conference was held at the Hotel Victoria yesterday between Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, and other national officers of the federation to settle a number of jurisdictional disputes among unions before the annual convention of the American Federation of Labor, which begins on November 11. Several were settled. The first session of the convention will be at the Jamestown exposition grounds. The other sessions will be at Norfolk, Va.

RAILROAD COTTON RATES UPHeld.

Washington, Oct. 26.—The Interstate Commerce Commission, in an opinion rendered to-day by Commissioner Clements, has decided that the rate of \$1.25 a hundred pounds on baled cotton goods from Southern cotton mills by way of Pacific Coast ports to Asiatic ports is not excessive. The decision also holds that the rate does not discriminate against Southern mills in favor of the more distant Eastern mills which ship cotton goods to Asiatic ports by way of the Pacific Ocean.
