BRINGS WORD OF ISTHMIAN CONDITIONS. Major John L. Phillips, superintendent of the United States Hospital, at Ancon, Panama, arrived here, yesterday on a brief business trip from the isthmus to gain headway at Panama under the sanitary condition of the isthmus, especially at Panama, was improving rapidly, and that the number of cases at the hospital was much lower than might be expected from a climate that was new to the thousands at work there.

"There is practically little or no chance for an epidemic to gain headway at Panama under the existing regulations," said Major Phillips. "The prevalence of mosquitoes is responsible for a number of malarial fever cases we have at the hospital, but the yellow fever patients are conspicuous by their absence. We are rapidly eliminating the mosquito by draining and a liberal use of crude petroleum."
