## NEXT WEEK OKLAHOMA BECOMES THE FORTY-SIXTH STATE IN THE UNION.

The new arrangement of stars upon the national flag, which has been adopted by the War and Navy departments and approved by the President, will show, after July 4, 1908, eight stars in the first, third, fourth and sixth rows and seven stars in the second and fifth rows—forty-six in all.
