SPATE ADMITS HIS IDENTITY.

[By Telegram to The Tribune.] Pittsburg, Nov. 30.—Oscar F. Spate, alias Reginald Spaulding, told Magistrate Brady all about himself to-day. He admitted that he is the man who obtained the contract for former Park Commissioner Clausen, of New York, for placing chairs in the parks; admitted that he had served a term in prison in South Africa; admitted that he is wanted in Montreal, Canada; denied that he had eloped with the daughter of Lady Suffolk, but steadfastly stood back of the statement that he was an intimate friend of the late Mrs. Suffolk herself, and that she had authorized him to come to America and negotiate with Americans for introductions at court. He even gave the date when he had called at her home and completed the arrangements.

After his story Magistrate Brady decided to send him to the workhouse for thirty days pending the arrival of extradition papers from Montreal, where Spate is wanted for alleged swindling.

MOB AVENGES ASSAULT BY NEGRO.

Opp. Ala., Nov. 30.—Neal Sanders, a young negro, was shot to death near here this afternoon by an angry crowd of Covington County citizens after he had been identified by Mrs. Ellis, a farmer's wife, who asserted that he had assaulted her near here to-day. Afterward a rope was tied around the negro's neck, and the body, secured to the back of a buggy, was dragged through the streets and negro settlement of the town.

INSANE MAN DEMANDED MILLIONS.

A poorly dressed man walked into the banking offices of Knauth, Nachod & Kuhne, No. 15 William street, yesterday and demanded \$10,000,000. He said he had won the money in a card game in Europe and that it was to be deposited for him by the bankers. The paying teller wrote an order on the "National Dream Bank" for the amount. When the man came back to ask where he could get the order cashed he was turned over to the police at the Old Slip station, who sent him to Bellevue. He gave his name as William Moll and said he had come from Akron, Ohio, Friday night.
