UNION OF STEAM ROADS

Fifty Short Lines in Association for Mutual Protection.

An association for the mutual protection of steam railroads which are under two hundred miles in length has been recently organized under the name of the Union of Steam Roads. The primary object of the association is to effect the passage of legislation that will allow the roads a more satisfactory compensation for carrying the mails, and to remove to a certain extent various restrictions and limitations imposed by the government upon the mail carrying end of the transportation business.

Mr. Searing, the vice-president, in speaking of the purpose of the association, said yesterday that it was incorporated principally with the idea of bringing about a change in the present postal laws applicable to the line railroads transporting mail. It was the intention of the association, he said, to seek amendments to the law which would increase the pay a mile a year, authorize payment for car space set aside for the exclusive use of the mail and for the messenger service in receiving and delivering mail at the terminals, and to provide for certain rules and regulations applicable to short lines. He added: "Every small steam railroad carrying the mail does more work for less pay than is accorded to any other method of transporting the mails. In the case of wagon or messenger doing like service the Postmaster General is allowed to use his discretion to the amount to be paid but in the case of the railroads the amount is fixed by statute, and in the case of the short lines is only 3/4 of a mile a year. We hope, with the strength and influence of a formidable organization such as we hope to build up, to prevail on Congress to grant us an increase of 1/2 mile a year, and with permission would probably be given the latter to join the organization."
