



CONGO HUTS WHICH SOMEWHAT RESEMBLE THE WIGWAMS OF OUR NORTH AMERICAN INDIANS.

These curious huts are found at Yambuya, one of the villages of the Congo Free State. The skeleton is made of poles and the outer covering is of clay and thatch. Yambuya is on the left bank of the Aruwimi River, just below its lowest rapid. The people who live in these huts gather rubber for King Leopold of Belgium.
