

WORK FOR GERMANS

How the Question of the Unemployed Is Solved.

Cologne, June 28. Germany has set an example for Europe in making employment for workers the most important national issue.

While the fiscal system in Germany, as in America, has been ordered for the benefit of wage earners at home, rather than for workers abroad, there cannot be complete immunity from unemployment when the population is rapidly increasing and immigrants are constantly coming into the empire from Russia and South-western Europe.

Cologne, like every other German industrial centre, has a labor bureau supported by the local government. There are bureau officials in charge of classified lists of applicants for work and there are waiting rooms where they can meet employers and make engagements with them.

Will Raze 17 Structures in Newark to Make Room for Additions.
