DAKOTA DECREE INVALID.

Wife, Alleging Error in Service, Now Sues Remarried Husband.

FOUR NEGROES LYNCHED

Victims Accused of Approving Murder of Farmer by Tenant.

Russellville, Ky., Aug. 1.—Four negroes, Virgil Tom and Robert Jones and Joe Riley, were taken from jail here early to-day and hanged to a tree on the edge of the town.

No shots were fired by the mob, which was composed of about fifty men, and the people of the town knew nothing of the affair until daylight revealed the four bodies dangling from a tree just outside Russellville on the Nashville pike.

The negroes who were lynched were members of a lodge, and at a meeting recently it is said they approved of the alleged murder of James Cunningham, a white farmer, by his negro tenant, Rufus Brown.

The negroes had been in jail for several days, and while there had been considerable unrest since the attempt on the part of the mob to take Browder, accused of being the slayer of a white man, from the jail.

There is no clew to the members of the band, as the jailer was the only person who saw them close enough to get a good look, and he could not recognize them.
