War of the "Devils" on Two Stages

Mr. Savage's Company Presents Molnar's Play at the Garden and Mr. Fiske's Players Open at the Belasco.

A play in three acts called "The Devil," made by Ferenc Molnar, an Hungarian journalist, was presented last night on two different stages and under opposing auspices. At the Garden Theatre Mr. Savage produced what he declared to be the only authorized version. It was an adaptation made by Oliver Herford from the German of "Der Teufel." Edwin Stevens acted the chief character in it. At the Belasco Harrison Grey Fiske gave a version made from the Hungarian by Alexander Konta and William Trowbridge Larned, and with a company headed by George Arliss.

THE BELASCO THEATRE. THE GARDEN CROWDED.

Was it the magic name "The Devil" or was it the spirit of interest that had been aroused in the public by the startling strokes of Harrison Grey Fiske in announcing the production of Ferenc Molnar's play of that name, without first securing the permission of Henry W. Savage, followed by Mr. Savage's equally startling retort in yesterday morning's newspaper that he would produce the play five minutes ahead of Mr. Fiske? Or was it some other more powerful and more potent inducement that crowded the Garden Theatre on a midsummer night in a way that it has not long been crowded?

If there are those who believe that New Yorkers cannot be induced to go to the theatre on a warm night in that autumn when they would have found retort of his opinion last night by attempting to get into the Garden Theatre. Long before 8:30, when the curtain went up on the scene of the studio of the artist, Karl Mahler, it was real work to try to get through the solid phalanx which massed itself in the rear of the house.

To be sure, Mr. Savage did not make good his threat to produce the play five minutes ahead of Mr. Fiske, but the malign but inevitable influence of his Satanic majesty is portrayed, five minutes before the first words of the players in Mr. Fiske's production were to be heard at the Belasco Theatre. But, then, Mr. Fiske had a distinct advantage over Mr. Savage. His company had been for a month in secret rehearsal at Tarrytown, and Monday morning's newspapers started a notoriously indiscreet manager into one of the busiest thirty-six hours of his career. Why, then, should not the audience be forgiving if the curtain were held fifteen minutes, so that everything might go off as smoothly as possible? The cast had practically been at work the entire thirty-six hours from noon on Monday in an endeavor to help out Mr. Savage in meeting Mr. Fiske's sudden attack as well as the circumstances and the short time at his disposal allowed.

Not only was the assembly forging, it was distinctly encouraging. Paul McAllister, the first one of the cast to appear, found it so, and so did Marion Lorne, who played the part of Mimi, the model, and Dorothy Dorr, who undertook the part of the rich banker's wife. Why, then, should not this spirit of friendliness break out in a storm at the sudden apparition of Edwin Stevens, the devil in the human form, rather than the devil in presentations along Broadway variously called musical comedy or musical farce, or what not, had long made a favorite with people who seek the theatre to be entertained? The storm was due, and, indeed, it came, when Mr. Stevens, whose figure and lineaments lend themselves readily to the representation of His Eminence of Hades, arose abruptly to disturb what the banker's wife imagined to be a good fellow, who had retired to a tête-à-tête with her former lover, the artist.

All this insistent applause was as nothing, however, to the uproar which followed the falling of the curtain on the second act, the scene at the ball given by the banker's wife. Mr. McAllister and Miss Dorr graciously retired and left the centre of the stage to Mr. Stevens, but though he took a few calls from the devil, a speech he was to make. Then it was that the strong voiced phalanx at the rear of the orchestra and in the balcony and galleries shouted: "Savage! Savage! Savage!" At last Mr. Stevens and Claxton Wilstach, the stage manager, succeeded in dragging out between them, to the delight of the audience, the tall form of the Boston real estate man, but though they howled for a word there was nothing that Colonel Savage would do except make his very best bow.
