BISHOP GREER'S PROBLEM. Question of Lightening His Labors Still Rife.

Episcopal clergymen returning from their vacations are discussing the probable action of the forthcoming convention of their diocese, whether it will elect a bishop coadjutor, take steps to create a new diocese of the rural counties, or let things remain as they are, expecting that soon a law will be adopted by their Church permitting the appointment or election of a bishop suffragan.

Asked his opinion on the subject, he replied that he would say nothing until the meeting of the convention in November, but that he intended saying some things at that time. It was impossible, however, to gather from him what might be his probable course, and no other leader in the diocese seems able to give any information.

Five years ago this fall Bishop Potter asked assistance, because the work of the diocese had become too great for one bishop. It has not grown less, and Bishop Greer is not a more vigorous man than was Bishop Potter in 1903.

No bishop coadjutor can be chosen unless Bishop Greer asks that one be. It is not thought likely that he will ask for one, unless in so doing he suggests a special convention in January or later for the election, in order to give time for the discussion of men to be elected.

MEMORIAL TO MR. SANKEY.

Ira D. Sankey, the famous companion of D. L. Moody, held what is supposed to be his last song service in Manhattan before his long illness began in the Church of the Puritans, 190th street and Fifth avenue. To-morrow evening a memorial service will be held in this church, at which his most famous hymns will be sung.


NEWS OF THE MARKETS.

The continued high price of fish is becoming monotonous, especially to the dealers. Butterfish, weakfish, sea bass and bonita mackerel are each 15 cents a pound. Kennebec salmon is 12 cents a pound. California salmon is 10 cents a pound.
