WOMAN'S SPRING STYLES.

Decree by National Cloak, Suit and Skirt Makers.

Chicago, Dec. 12.—The semi-annual convention of the National Cloak, Suit and Skirt Manufacturers issued a formal decree to-day as to styles of new spring apparel. The decree follows:

Two piece tailored suits—Hipless and half fitted jackets; cut away and straight fronts, 34 to 42 inches long and 20 to 36 inches long for misses; long, narrow coat sleeves.

Skirts—To be gored and of diminished fullness, with a tendency to high waisted effects.

Three piece suits—Without sleeves, with net or lace yokes, or made to be worn over waists with hipless jackets; cut away fronts predominating; long, small sleeves.

Tailored dresses—One piece complete dresses in both princess and raised waist effects; gimp dresses more particularly for misses and juniors.

Separate coats—Hipless and semi-fitted cloth jackets, with some tendency toward cutaway effects, 32 to 42 inches long for ladies and 30 to 36 inches long for misses; coat sleeves.

Coat tailoring or touring coats—Half-fitted empire or hipless effects, 32 to 54 inches long.

Silk and satin coats—All lengths.

Separate skirts—Similar to suit skirts, but show more trimming, mainly in vertical effects.

WANTS RICE REMOVED.

E. S. Mendels Threatens Drastic Action on Rawhide Coalition.

E. S. Mendels, head of the New York Curb Market Agency, which has general supervision over the Curb's affairs, has informed the Security Transfer and Registrar Company, the registrar of the stock of the Rawhide Coalition Company, whose shares have had such a sensational drop in price on the Curb in the last few days, that unless George Graham Rice, second vice-president of the mining

company, is dropped from the management he will be obliged to take drastic action in regard to the concern's connection with the Curb.

Asked what this action was likely to be, Mr. Mendels replied that it might possibly be to oust the company's stock from the Curb, although he was loath to take this action, he said, because of the damage that might result to innocent investors by preventing them from readily marketing their holdings. Mr. Mendels said that before the company had been permitted to list its stock it had been required to comply with the rules of the Curb by furnishing full reports of its history and condition, and that its application, with the names of all the officers, had been posted on the Curb bulletin for the required five days, when, no objection having been filed against it by any one, the stock was regularly listed.

He added that he had known nothing of Mr. Rice's alleged prison record until he read the published account of it yesterday.

Rawhide Coalition opened at 75 cents yesterday, five points above the preceding day's close, and advanced another point to 76 cents. The bears then began hammering the stock, and it dropped a few cents at a time to 67 cents. Then came a rally, which carried the price to 76 cents, at which it closed.
