GLEW TO MAIL BOX THEFTS.

Arrest of Bad Check Passer in Minnesota May Also Explain Shooting.

Inspector James, of the Postoffice Department, received advices yesterday of the arrest at Stillwater, Minn., of a man giving the name of John Conly. He was arrested, it is understood, for trying to pass a worthless check. His capture, Inspector James said, would probably help the department in solving the mystery of several letter box robberies in this city. The arrest of Conly may also clear the motive for the shooting of a young man named Bein in a Greenwich avenue saloon several days ago. The dispatch from the Stillwater authorities said that the prisoner had several apparently raised checks. It is believed that these checks were taken from mail boxes in this city. One of these, Inspector James said, was one of twenty stolen on November 28 last from the hall-way letter box of Samuel Wertheimer, dealer in soda water supplies at No. 75 Vesey street. The man heard from a customer in Stillwater that he had forwarded a check for \$37 in payment of goods.
