

ST. YVES WINS BIG MARATHON DERBY

Continued from first page.

It seemed that many would be kept away by the early rain and the threat of more to follow, and, indeed, there were empty seats in the more expensive sections that would have been filled to overflowing had the sun shone all day.

It looked like a baseball day at first, but as one got inside and mingled with the crowd there was a different element. Women were not so numerous as they often are at baseball games, but there were a good many. Their hats were a little bit ahead of even the present amazing fashions, and they struck a note in dress, in manner and in speech different from that one observes among feminine devotees of the national game.

Inspector Thompson sent a squad of patrolmen to the entrance at 10 o'clock in the morning. At that time three hundred men and boys, some of whom had been about the place since daylight, were on hand. The doors were opened at noon, by which time extra details of police had arrived. Several men who reached the grounds before daylight got into cars standing on a siding, but when the early morning rush began they were routed out.

The crowd gathered slowly at first, but in ever increasing numbers as the time for the race approached. It rained for a time, but when the start came the weather gods were kind, umbrellas came down and everybody settled back to enjoy the Marathon Derby.

It was a crowd of enthusiasts. Every sprint from start to finish of the long race had its burst of wild applause, and every runner had his quota of adherents. For a favorite, Longboat evoked surprisingly little enthusiasm, perhaps because he gave his backers so little chance to cheer him. The wildest enthusiasm, perhaps, was for Dorando. There were not any more Italians in the stands than Irishmen or Americans, but they were more demonstrative.

Most of Shrubbs' support came from good Americans, who had given up hope, apparently, of a victory for Hayes and wanted to see Anglo-Saxon supremacy upheld. There was wild cheering when Shrubbs took the lead, but St. Yves, unknown at the start, won a host of friends by his amazing runniz and was a popular victor.

The crowd was not so cohesive as the one that saw Chicago win the pennant from the Giants last year. It was too varied in its sympathies, and was, in a way, a colder assemblage. Its units were enthusiastic enough, as has been suggested, but they failed to form great groups. Still, it was a crowd even more interesting, in a way, than one at a baseball game, and it expressed its varied and divided feelings in a manner that could have been heard downtown.

Each runner had his camp, designated by a big flag representing his nationality, and at these points the handlers of the respective men doled out from time to time liquid refreshments and coached their men in the running of the race. Beyond urging him on faster and faster, the race watchmen over the fortunes of St. Yves had nothing to do until the Frenchman had passed into the twenty-second mile. At that point he was refreshed with a mild shower from the sponge, and later he had a swallow or two of some stimulant. The other men did not lack for attention, and it was simply a case of their not being good enough to defeat the newcomer. St. Yves is rather short in stature, but his legs are stocky and his chest massive. At the finish he was hardly drawing a long breath, which proved his remarkable lung capacity and excellent condition.

With the crack of Tim Sullivan's pistol the pack set out as if they had to go only a quarter of a mile instead of the heart-breaking Marathon Derby. Dorando dug his toes in the turf and promptly took the pole, closely followed by St. Yves. Shrubbs came next, with Longboat alongside. Then came Maloney, with Hayes last. From the start Hayes began to lose ground steadily, and Maloney slipped back a few yards. Before the mile had been completed St. Yves sprinted into the lead, and some surprise was manifested when Shrubbs made no effort to stay with the Frenchman. Instead, Shrubbs seemed content to lay in behind Dorando, while Longboat clung to the Italian's heels. St. Yves' time for the mile was 5:34—fast on that track.

Two laps further St. Yves lapped Hayes, and a little further on Dorando, Shrubbs and Longboat all passed the Olympic winner. At two and a half miles St. Yves gained a lap on Hayes. The latter was running under orders, his trainer, Ernest Hysterberg, telling him to go easily and pay no attention to the others. It was also evident that Shrubbs was bent on running a far different race than when he ran himself into the ground against Longboat at the Garden last winter.

The same order was maintained to the two-mile mark, which St. Yves passed in 10:41. They moved along in the same order, with Hayes always dropping back, and at three miles, which the Frenchman covered in 15:25, Dorando, Shrubbs and Longboat were a quarter of a lap behind. At three and a half miles St. Yves lapped Hayes twice, and the trio did likewise a little later. Half a mile further St. Yves lapped Maloney. The Frenchman covered the five miles in 23:45. About that time Shrubbs, unable to restrain himself any longer, let out a link and set sail after St. Yves. At five miles, which the Frenchman covered in 28 minutes flat, Shrubbs was only a few yards behind the leader. Dorando and Longboat were not more than twenty yards behind the Englishman.

EFFORTS TO OVERHAUL ST. YVES. The last named drew up two laps further, only to have the man from France rush away and lead in 33:15, with the other three close up. About that time Dorando took it into his head to get after the Frenchman, but when he caught up St. Yves sailed away again after the fashion of Shrubbs in his memorable race with the Indian.

At seven miles St. Yves was leading his nearest competitors by 15 yards, the Frenchman's time being 42:45. Up to that stage Hayes was three and one-half laps behind, and Maloney a lap and a half. St. Yves passed the eighth mile in 46:30, and then had Hayes by four laps and Maloney by two. Another sprint by St. Yves lapped up a clear lead of 100 yards on the pack. SHRUBBS CATCHES FRENCHMAN. At ten miles St. Yves was still leading in 57:25, but two laps further Shrubbs not only drew level with St. Yves, but actually passed the

THE MARATHON DERBY OF \$10,000, divided as follows: \$5,000 to the winner, \$2,500 to the second, \$1,500 to the third and \$1,000 to the fourth. Race run over six lap track at Polo Grounds for full distance of 26 miles 52 1/2 yards. Time of winner, 2:40:56 1/2, which is accepted as a record. Distance finishing men indicated in yards.

Shrubbs did not finish. St. Yves made the running for ten miles, lay behind Shrubbs for next eight and then drew away to win as he pleased. Dorando dropped out of it after going twelve miles, but finished strong, and was second best on race on his feet. Hayes lapped several times in early part, but was apparently to instruction Shrubbs found the distance too far. Longboat ran well for twelve miles, and then had trouble with his feet.

was faster than any of the other Marathons except the Dorando-Shrubbs affair at Buffalo. Another long and sustained sprint enabled Shrubbs to lap Dorando soon after passing the thirteenth mile post. St. Yves was there as well, and they both lapped Longboat a little later. Shrubbs' time for thirteen miles of 1:14:15 was ahead of the previous marks for the same distance.

By this time the fourteen-mile mark had been covered by Shrubbs and St. Yves had continued to increase their lead to a lap and a quarter on Longboat and Dorando, while Maloney and Hayes continued to drop back. The time of the leaders, 1:30:16-17, was a world's record for races of this kind.

About this time Hayes began to increase his pace and draw away from Maloney, who had been his slight margin for several miles. The crowd gave the Irish-American plenty of encouragement, although he was six and a half laps behind the leaders and six behind Longboat and Dorando. Shrubbs' time for fifteen miles, 1:52:23, was also a record.

Dorando began to draw away from St. Yves and appeared to be in the distance. Shrubbs and St. Yves covered sixteen miles in 1:52:23-15, and a little later they lapped Longboat for the second time. Dorando and Hayes were moving together, although there was the same wide margin between them. Up to this time Shrubbs and St. Yves had shown no signs of weakening, the Frenchman steadily moving up efforts at the start. The pair made the seventeen miles in 1:58:49-55, and four laps further Longboat suddenly stopped at his training quarters and received a vigorous rubbing. He started up again, however, but not until all the others had gained two laps.

Although Shrubbs led at eighteen miles, St. Yves started a sprint that even Shrubbs failed to hold. Just before the leaders had covered nineteen miles Longboat again set down and wanted to quit, but his handlers persuaded him to continue. At nineteen miles St. Yves led Shrubbs by three-quarters of a lap. The former's time was 1:59:24—quarters ahead of the record, continuing at the same way ahead of the record, continuing at the same way ahead of the record.

St. Yves lapped Shrubbs at twenty killing pace. St. Yves' time being 1:57:25-1-3, more than two minutes ahead of the record. Just before this Longboat, who had started in the race a favorite, stopped for good. Dorando lost a little ground by stopping to put on a sweater. St. Yves' time for twenty-one miles was 2:03:45. SHRUBBS DROPS OUT. St. Yves covered twenty-two miles in 2:10:15-15. The Frenchman was more than two laps ahead of Shrubbs, while Dorando was third, with twenty-one miles and three laps. Then came Maloney, with twenty-one miles and one lap, with Hayes bringing up the rear. The Olympic winner had run twenty miles and five laps.

Continuing with the same choppy little stride, St. Yves covered twenty-three miles in 2:17:36. This was away ahead of all records, nearly six minutes better than the time for the same distance in the Dorando-Longboat race at the Garden. Dorando moved into second place by passing Shrubbs in the second lap of the twenty-fourth mile. The Italian made a great effort to stop to walk for a brief lap, but he started up again, trying to keep ahead of Maloney. Another and final lap on Shrubbs' part gave third place to Maloney at twenty-five miles. St. Yves' time was 2:22:11-3-5.

Soon after twenty-five miles had been run Hayes passed Maloney and took third place. It was then a question if Hayes would overhauled Dorando. St. Yves spurted away in rare fashion and won the race by four laps amid a roar that fairly shook the stands. Dorando spurted throughout his last lap and beat Hayes by more than two laps. The Italian's time was 2:45:37, and he beat Maloney by more than a lap. The latter got fourth, his time being 2:50:29. The leader and time for each mile of the race follow:
